NECESSARY TOOLS

B&W Printer



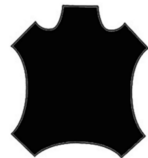
Scissors or a cutter



Hole Puncher



5 square feet of leather



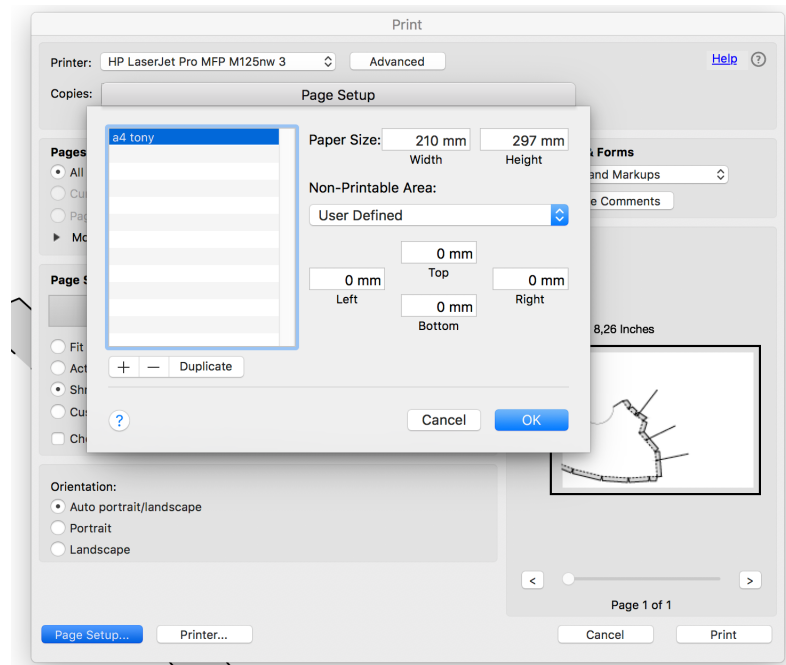
Thread and needles



PRINTING THE PATTERN

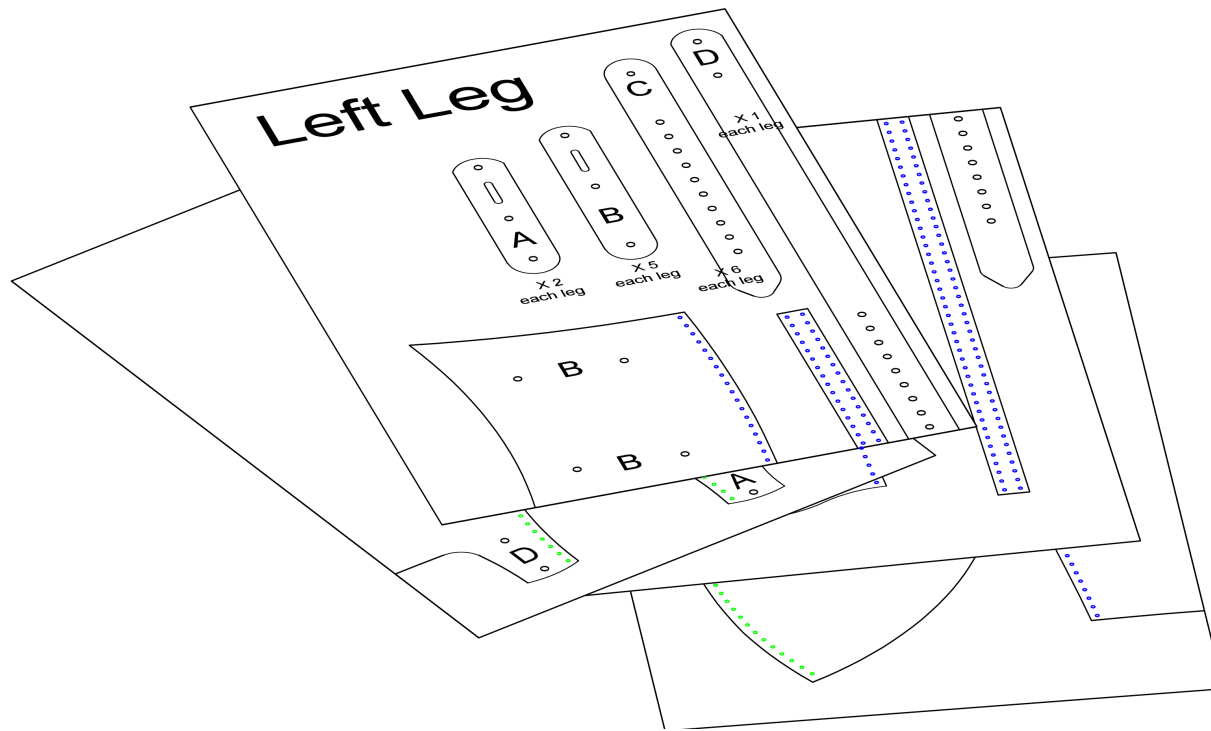
Set up your printer to A4 paper with no margins on landscape mode.

Alternatively you can use "letter" format which is approximately the same size and will not impact the size of the product significantly

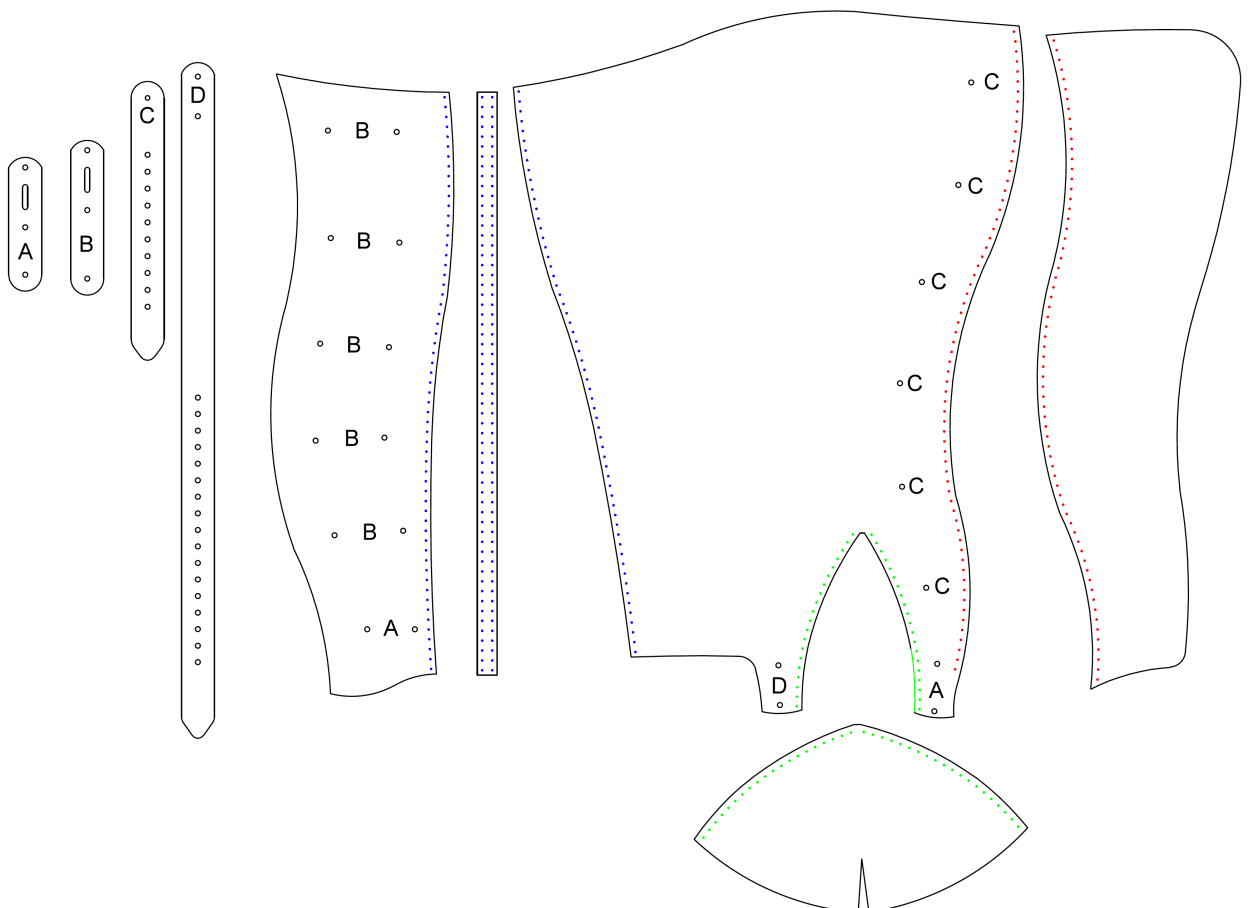


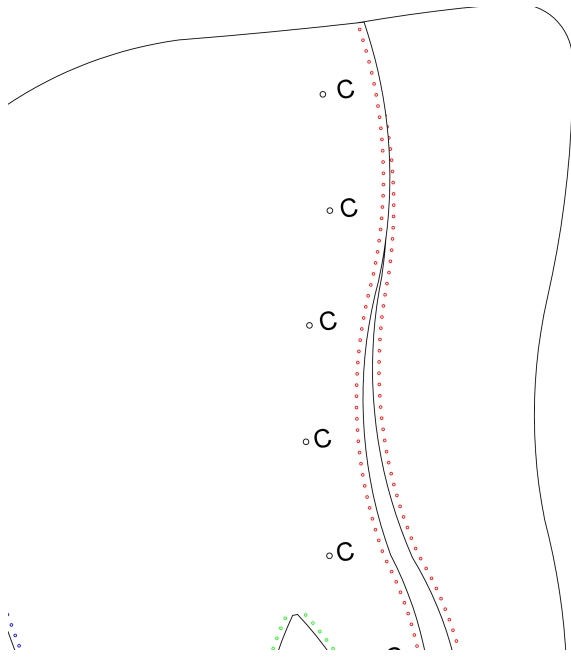
LETS START!

Step 1:
print your
patterns



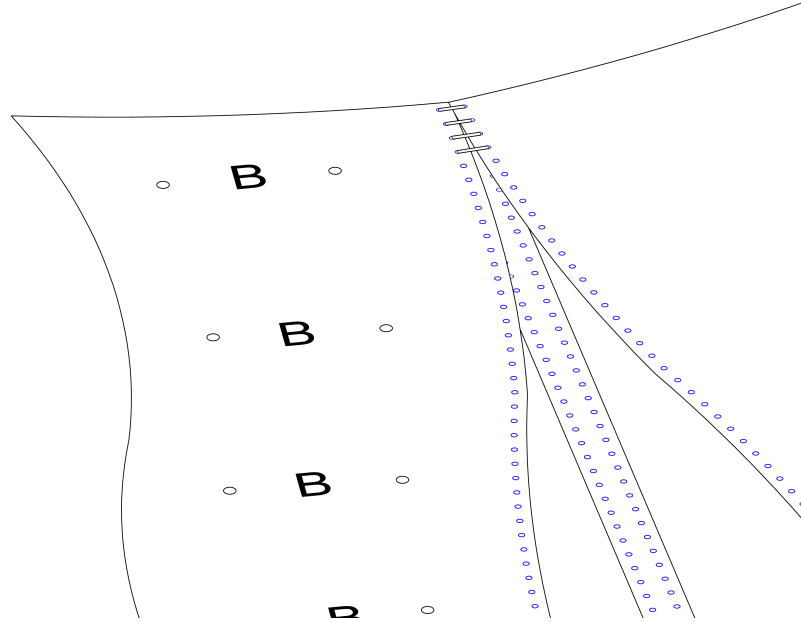
Step 2: Cut out all the parts and paste them as shown in this picture





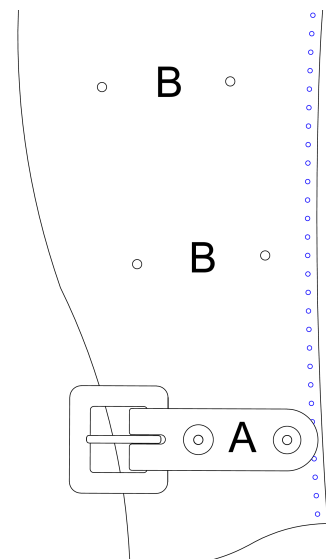
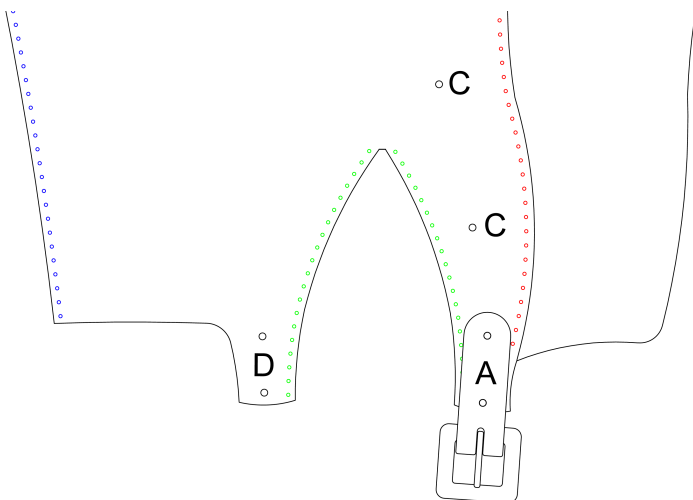
Step 3: Use the colours to guide you where the parts need to be stitched together. Eg: red to red, green to green. For the blue stitching use the long strip of leather on the inside to reinforce your stitching without compromising the design.

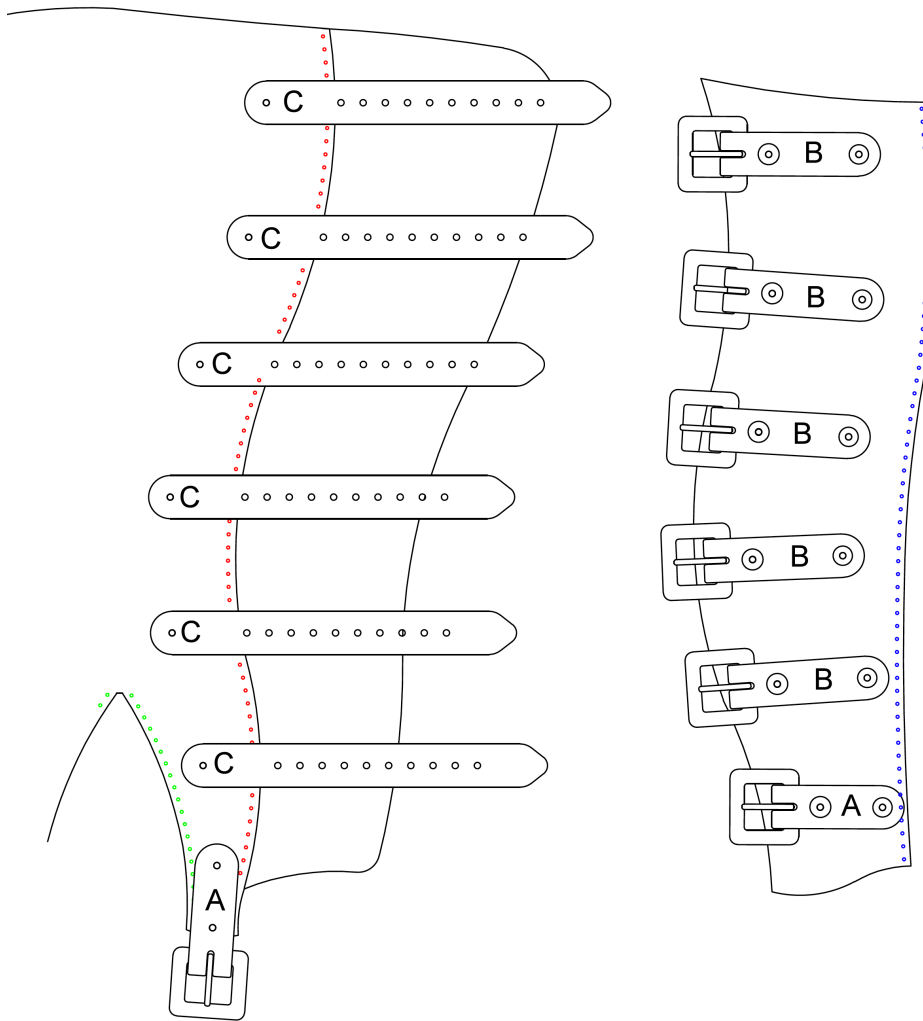
Step 4: For the blue stitching use the long strip of leather on the inside to reinforce your stitching without compromising the design.



Step 5: Last stitching is the laces guard along coloured in green

Step 6: Next Attach the straps. The letters will guide you where all the parts go. Note there are two slightly shorter buckle straps coded with A. Make sure to place these in the proper place.





Step 7: The other straps and buckles go to B and C. Note that the D coded strap is the longest one and it goes under the boot to keep your gaiter from sliding up whilst walking.

After this step you finished the left gaiter. Time for a cup of coffee before moving on to the right one!



Last Step: Pretty obvious, you now need to open the pattern for the right leg and repeat everything once again.
