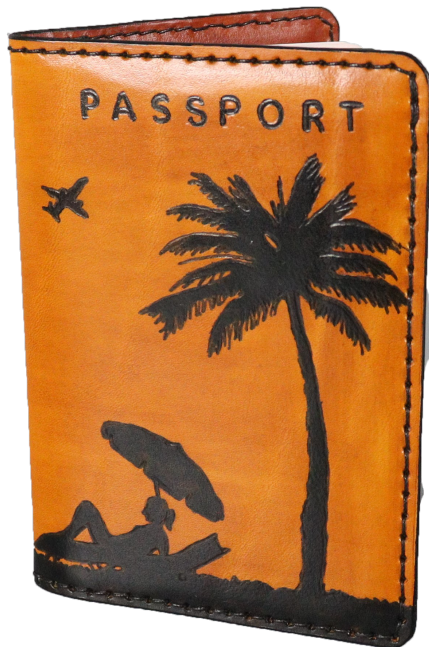


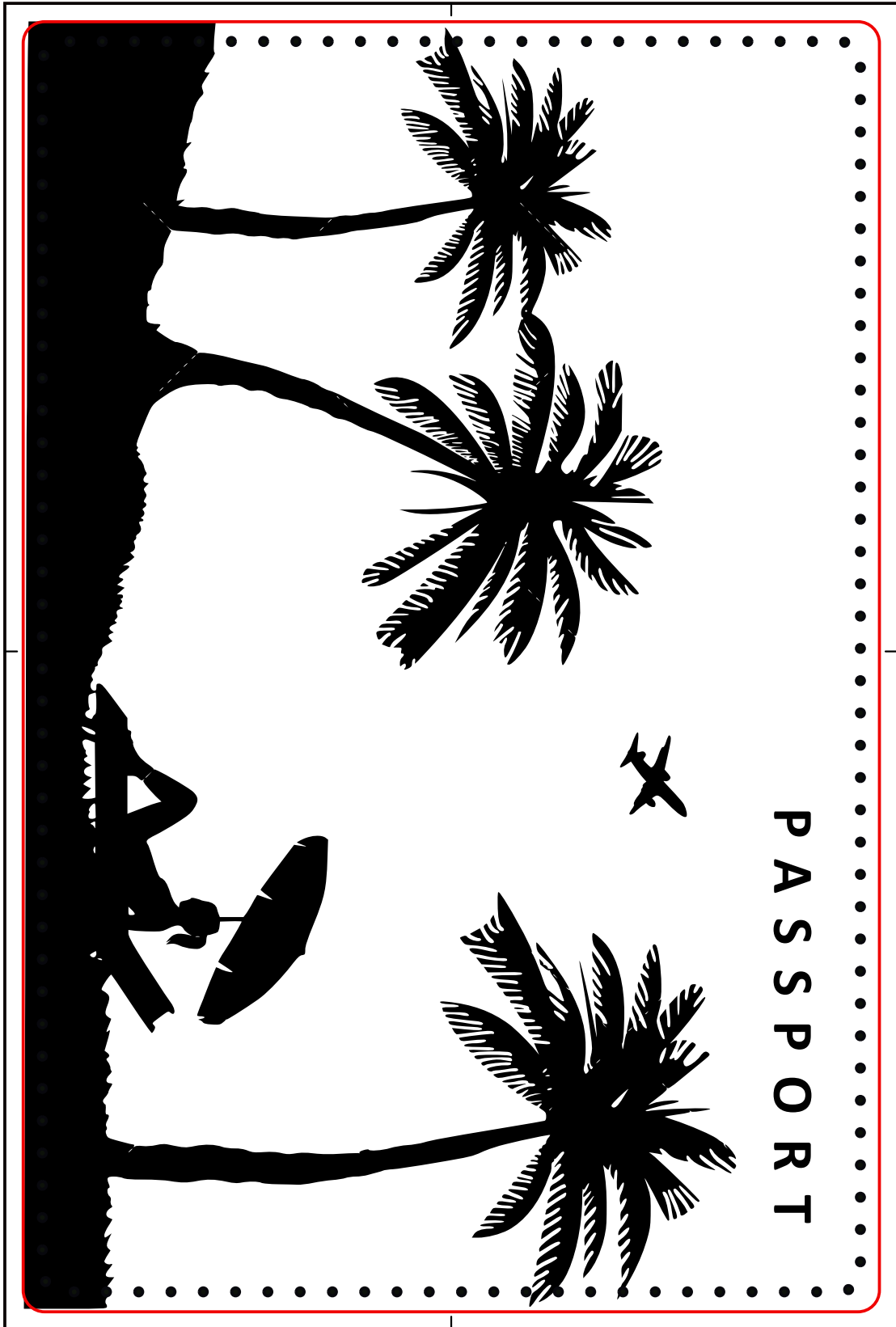

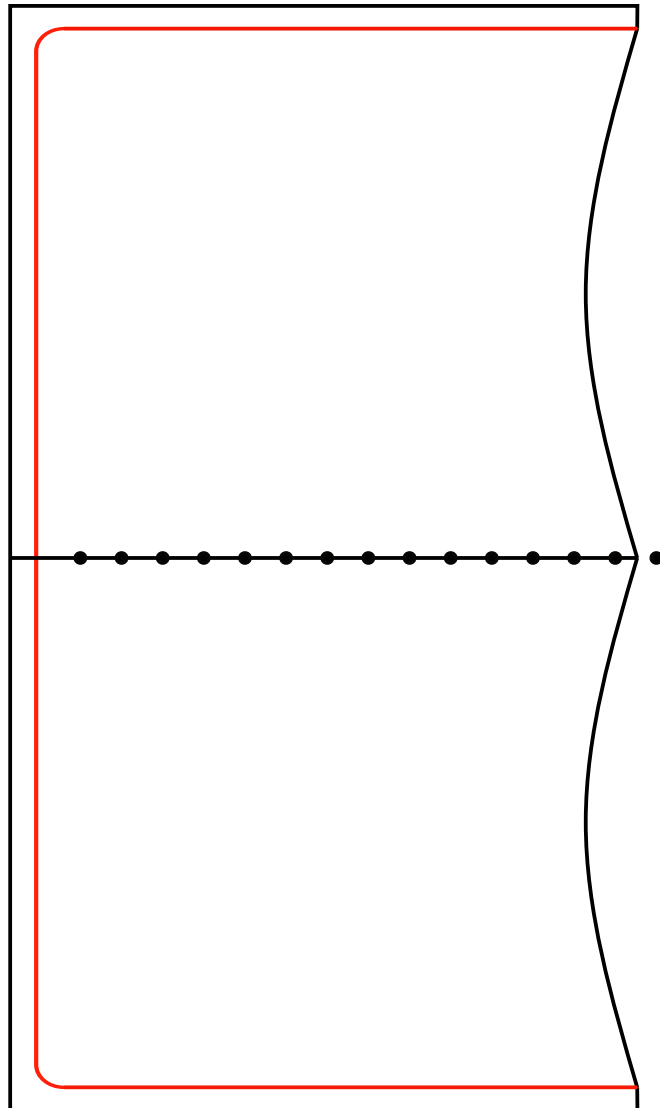

1st step is to print out the patterns, then proceed to cut them out.

Use masking tape to hold the outer cover pattern on the leather.

Use your 0.5 mm hole punch to open the stitch holes before cutting out the pattern on the leather.

Do the same process for the other parts of the wallet. Hold the pattern with a masking tape, open the stitch holes where necessary and then cut it out on the leather.

Align the pocket with the inner cover. Use masking tape to hold the pocket in place. Then use a silver pen or pencil to mark the stitch holes on the inner cover. Then proceed to open the stitch holes with your hole punch.

2nd step is to engrave your art on the outer cover. Then paint it with leather dye pens.

Hold your printout drawing on the outer cover with masking tape.

Use your round tip metal stylus to engrave the art on the leather following the outer lines of the art.

Make sure you apply enough pressure while engraving so to make sure that marks are visible after you remove the art paper.

3rd step is to dye your patterns to your desired colors.

Apply your dyes using a dabber or dye pens and let them dry for approximately 30 mins depending on how deep is your dye.

4th step is to trace and paint your art on the outer cover.

Use a dye pen of your choice and trace out the art on the outer cover following your engraved lines.

After tracing the outlines, proceed to paint the inner spaces using your dye pen or brush.

Use clean paper towel or cloth to brush off the excess dye residues on the surface.

Apply leather balm on the surface and burnish it to shine using clean paper towel or canvas cloth.

5th step is to bevel the pocket and inner cover edges, burnish them and skive the outer edges.

Use no. 1 beveler to bevel the window edges of the inner cover and the upper edges of the pocket.

After that, apply edge kote to the beveled edges and burnish with your slicker.

Skive the outer edges of the pocket and inner cover with your skiving machine or skiving knife.

Apply your logo on the pocket using hot stamp press or any other means you have.

Apply leather balm on the surfaces and burnish to shine using paper towel or canvas cloth.

6th step is to burnish the fresh sides of the leather and stitch the pocket to the inner cover.

Apply edge kote to the fresh sides of the leather and spread evenly using your spatula.

Burnish with a glass slicker and set aside to dry for some minutes.

Use a scrapper to scrap off the edge surface of the inner cover where the pocket will be attached.

Apply contact adhesive to the pocket edges and gently attach it to the inner cover making sure the edges align together.

Hold firm with paper clips and allow to set for some minutes.

After that, stitch the pocket to the inner cover.

7th step is to join the outer cover with the inner cover and stitch them up.

Apply contact adhesive to the edges of the outer cover and join the inner cover to the outer cover starting with the pocket side first.

Trim the stitch allowance off and attach the rest of the inner cover to the outer cover.

Use your hole puncher to open the stitch holes on the inner cover following the outer cover stitch holes.

Stitch-up the two parts using your stitching pony.

Use your metal roller to flatten the stitches and use your round punch or knife to round-off the corner edges.

Sand down the edges from 400 grit to 1000 grit to smoothen the edges for burnishing.

After that, bevel the edges using no. 1 beveler.

Dye the edges and apply edge kote. Then burnish to shine using edge slicker and canvas cloth.

Clear the pockets of any excess adhesive using your bone folder.

Apply leather balm to the wallet surfaces and burnish to shine for the last time.

Check that everything fits well.

You now have a nice-looking leather passport holder.
