NECESSARY TOOLS

B&W Printer



Scissors or a cutter



Hole Puncher (We recommend 1.8 - 2 mm sized holes for this build)



Scraps of leather. (We recommend 5-6oz leather for this build)

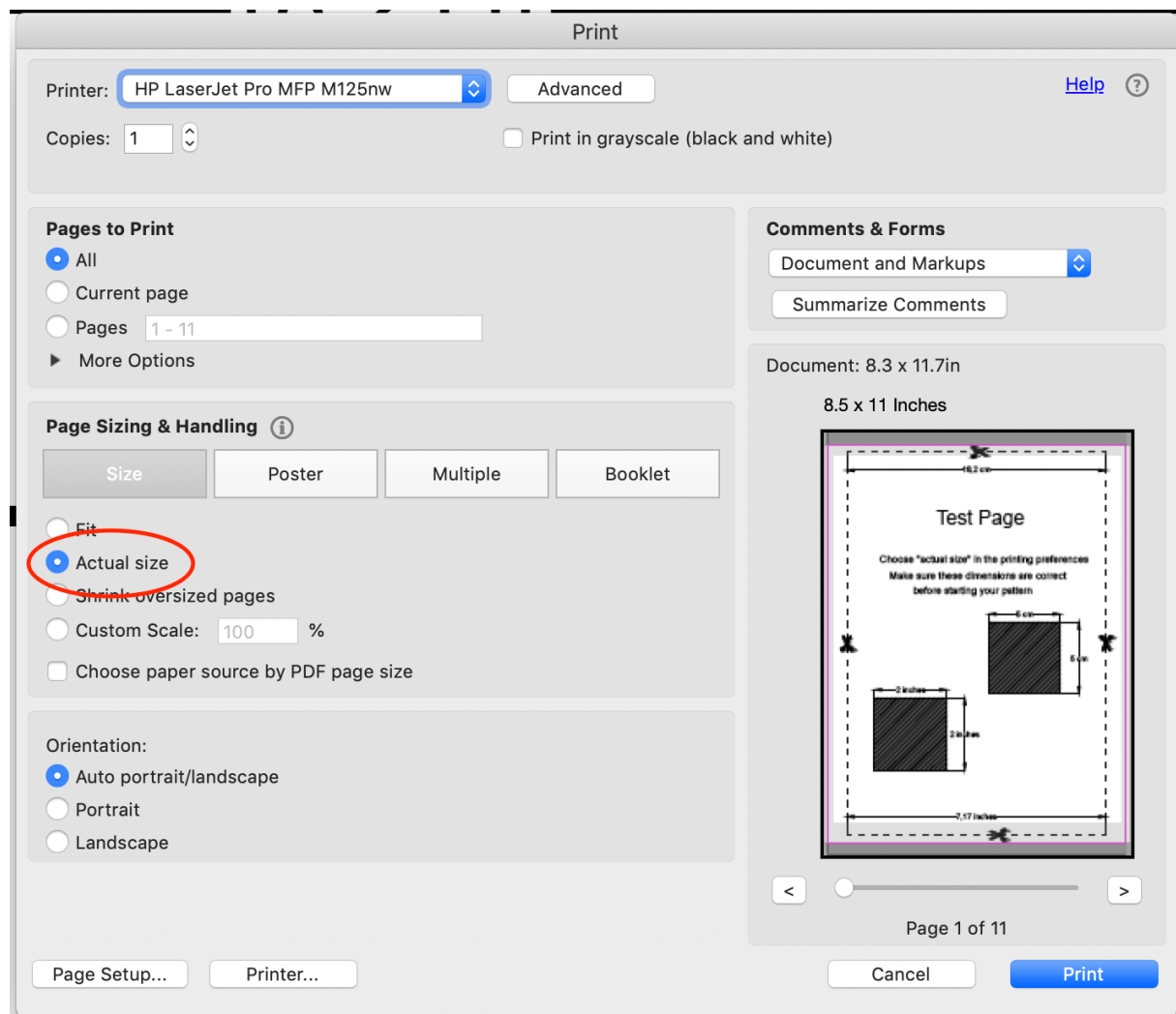


Thread and needles (We recommend 1.2 mm waxed thread for this build)



PRINTING THE PATTERN

Set up your paper size to A4 and choose actual size in the printer settings



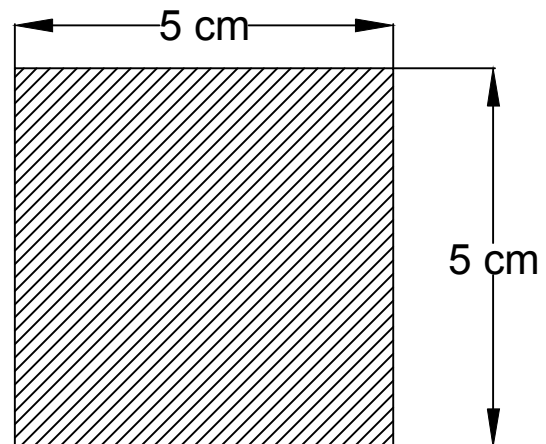
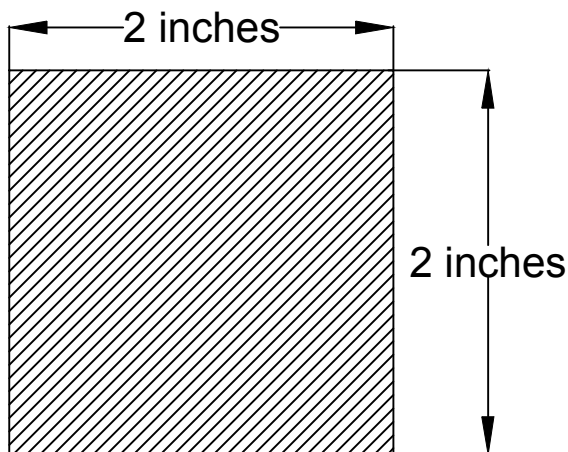
Alternatively you can use “letter” format which is approximately the same size and will not impact the size of the product significantly

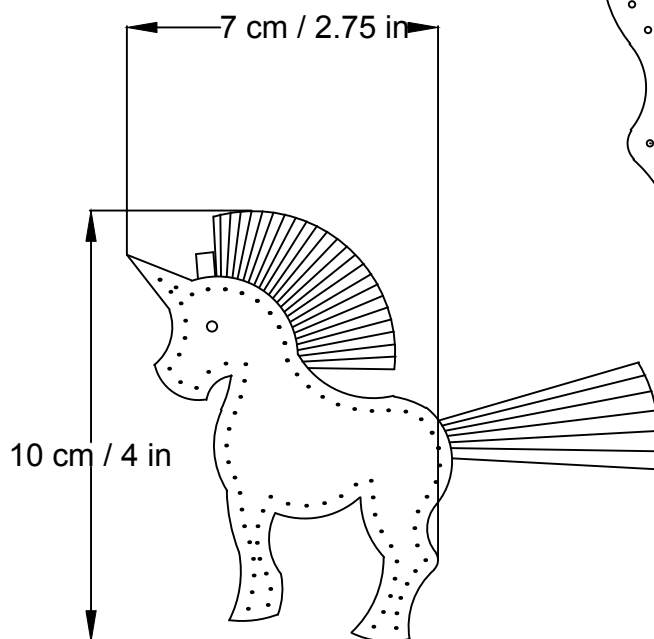
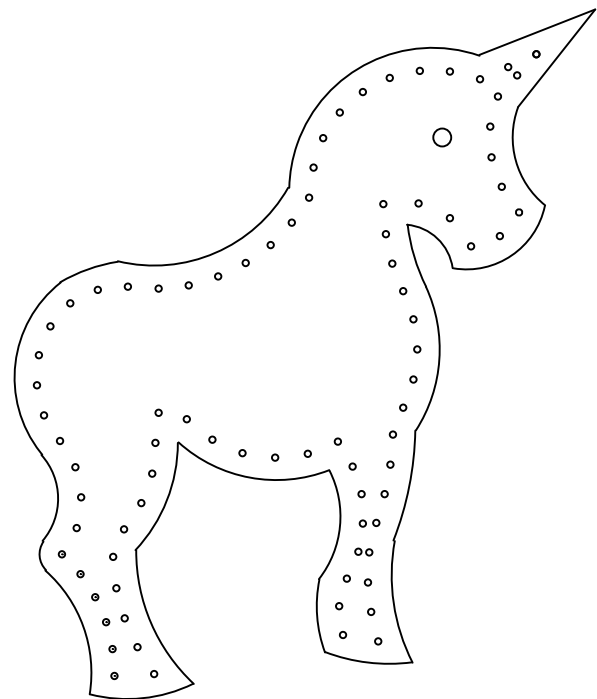
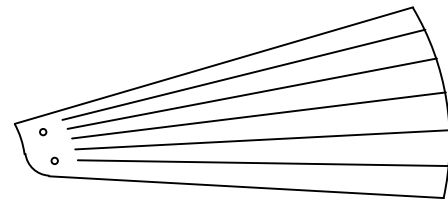
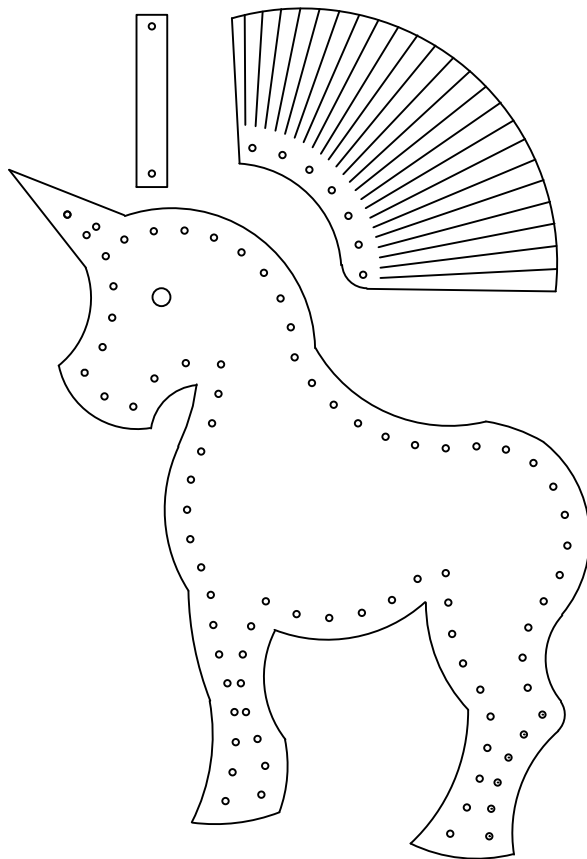
Select A4 in the paper size printing menu

before starting your pattern



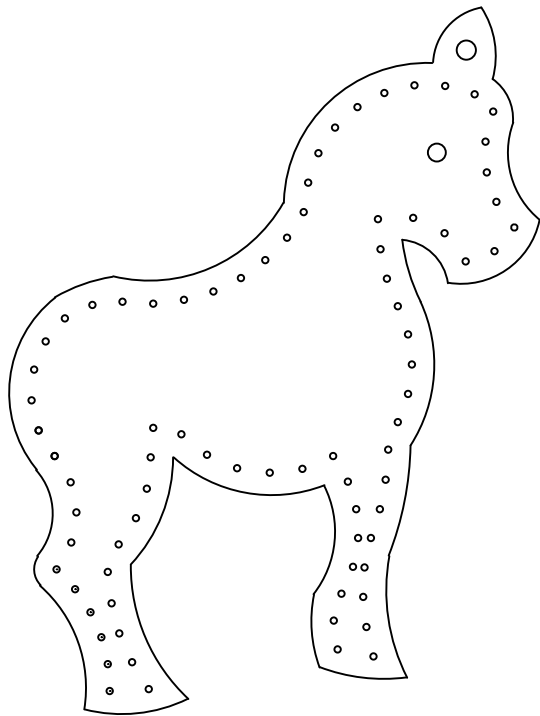
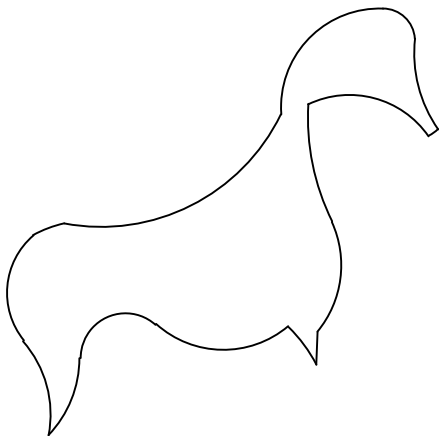
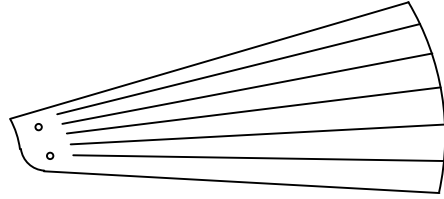
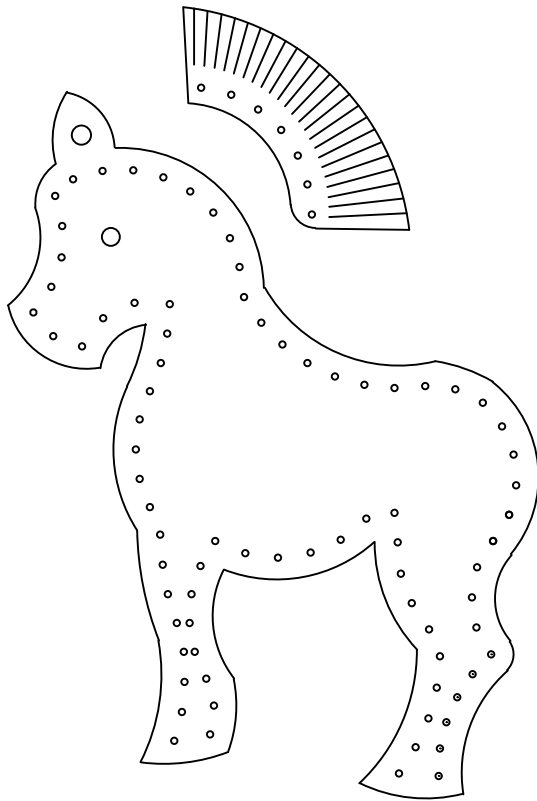

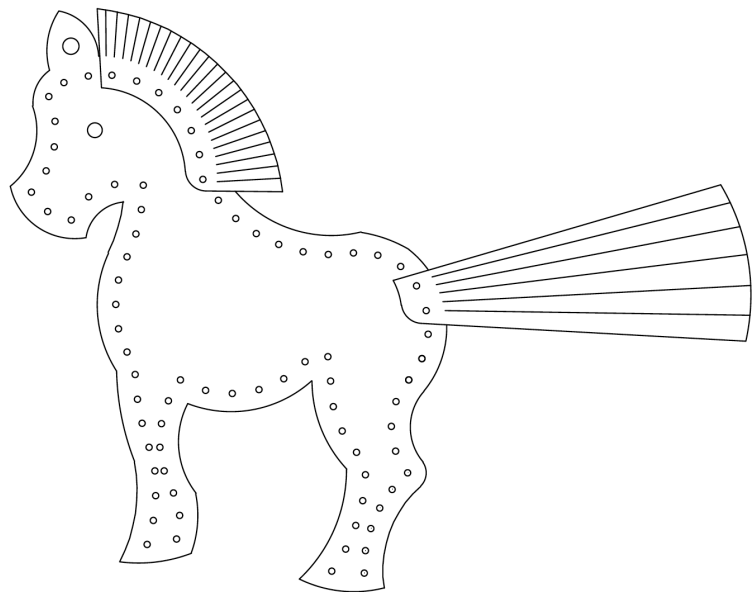

Use all the patterns at the end of this document and print using the instructions provided. Cut all the leather and stitch around the edges

Insert the mane and the tail as shown here between the two faces of the charm



I recommend an exacto knife for the small details and a round corner leather puncher set off eBay or Amazon like these



All the pieces have letters to show the order in which they need to be stacked on top of each other



Use different colours, make this your own charm, attach it to your keys, to your bag or make this an unexpected small gift for a friend, they will love it!
