The Backpack size - 300 mm (h) x 250 mm (w) x 100 mm (d)

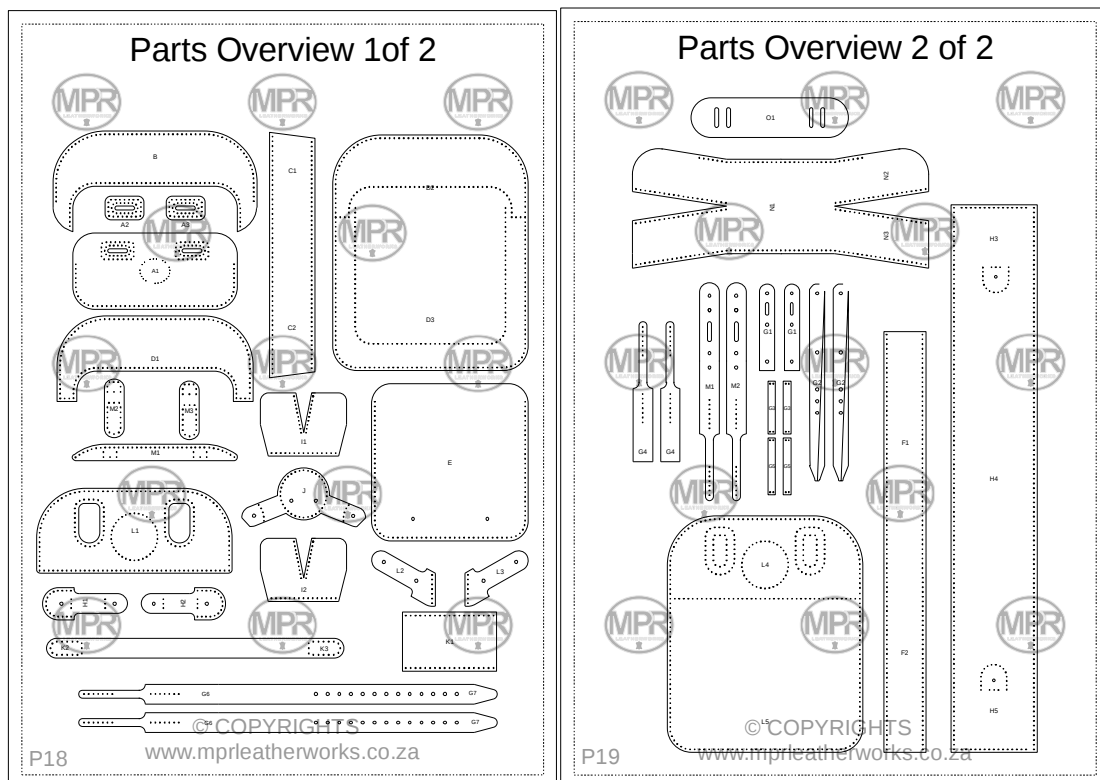
The backpack was made with vegetable tanned top grain leather +-2.4mm (5-6oz) thickness.

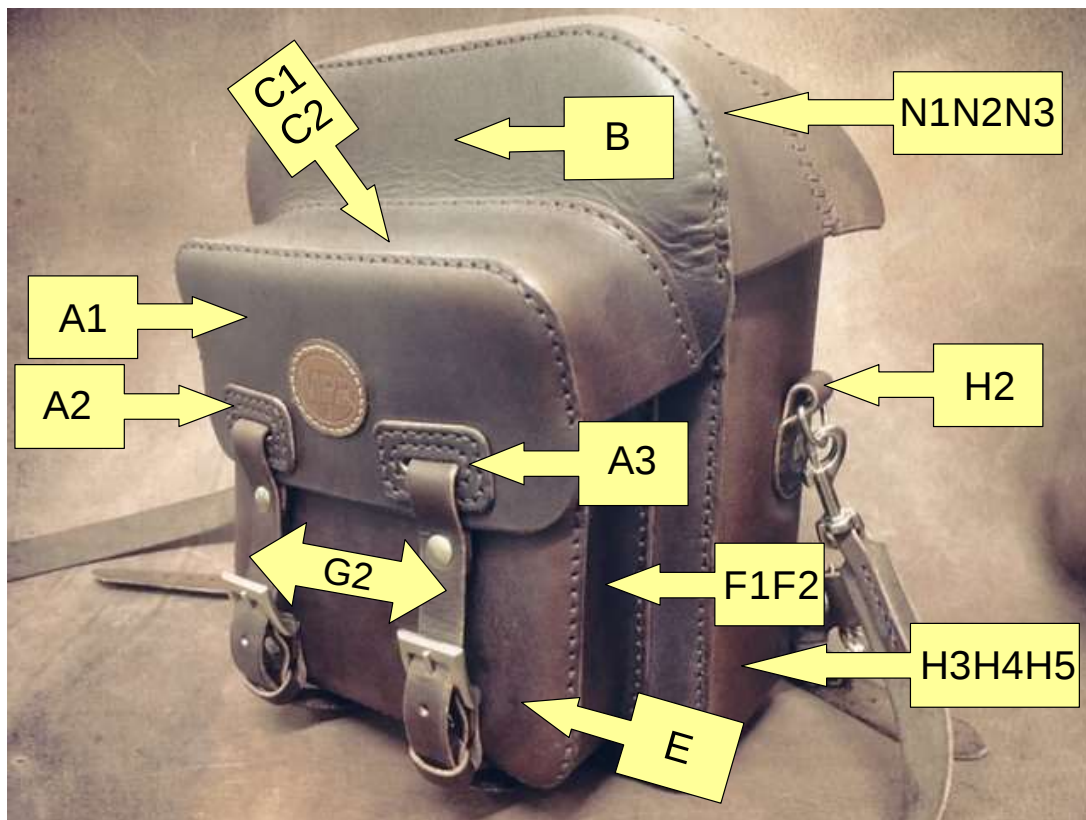

Once you are ready to assemble, take a careful look at the pictures 1 to 7 below to understand where each part fits.

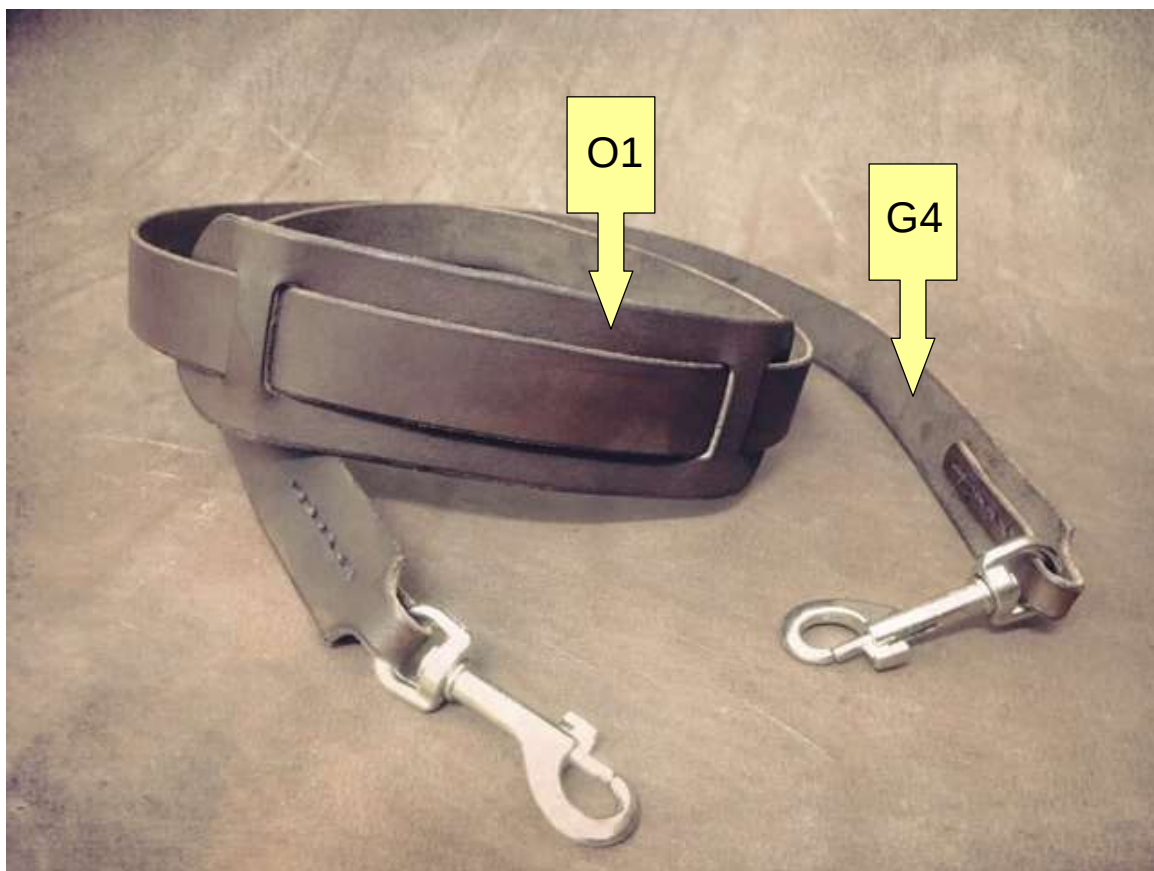
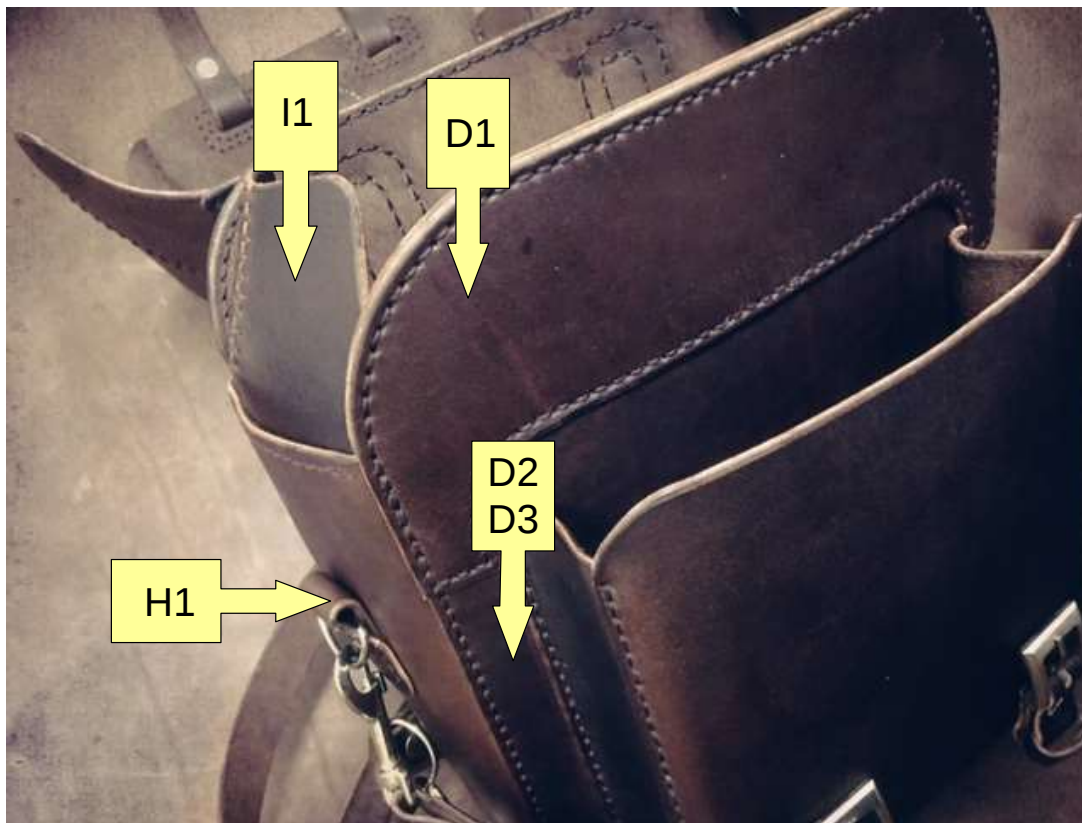
It is not a difficult project, it just takes a bit of time to assemble, but well worth it in the end.

The tools required for this build are:

- a) Printer to print Black & White PDF files onto A4 sized paper
- b) Stanley knife with sharp new blades
- c) Waxed thread 1mm and 2 (two) matching harness needles (it does not require sharp points)
- d) Leather hole punch 1.5mm & 4mm.
- e) Oblong punch - 5mm x 25mm
- f) Vegetable tanned leather with thickness of +-2.4mm (5-6oz) was used (Strongly recommended).
- g) Leather glue for logo, before you stitch.
- h) Buckles – 2 X 20mm & 2 X 25mm
- i) D-rings – 6 X 25mm
- j) Screw rivets – 2 X 8mm (L) with 9mm head size.
- k) Tubular rivets – 8 X 9mm (L) with 11mm head size
- l) Tubular rivets – 4 x 9mm (L) with 9mm head size (Used for parts M1 & M2).
- m) Trigger hooks – 6 X 15mm (w) length 65mm
- n) Patience, passion and a love for working with leather, of which I am sure you have more than enough!

Tips:

- 1) Take your time and prepare all the parts for this project before you start the assembly process.
- 2) Now carefully look at the pictures above to see where every part must go. It is actually very easy to build, and I cannot wait to see what your project looks like.

Printing the pattern:

Check out the – **Printer Setting Page**. The (yellow coloured circles) indicates which boxes must be checked to ensure that the correct printing size is selected, before you print the – **Test Page - . (This is very important)**

Once the – **Test Page** – is printed, measure both the vertical and horizontal sides with a ruler to ensure it is correct, before you print the actual pattern pages.

The Barrel Bag size - 250 mm (l) x 170 mm (w) x 160 mm (h)

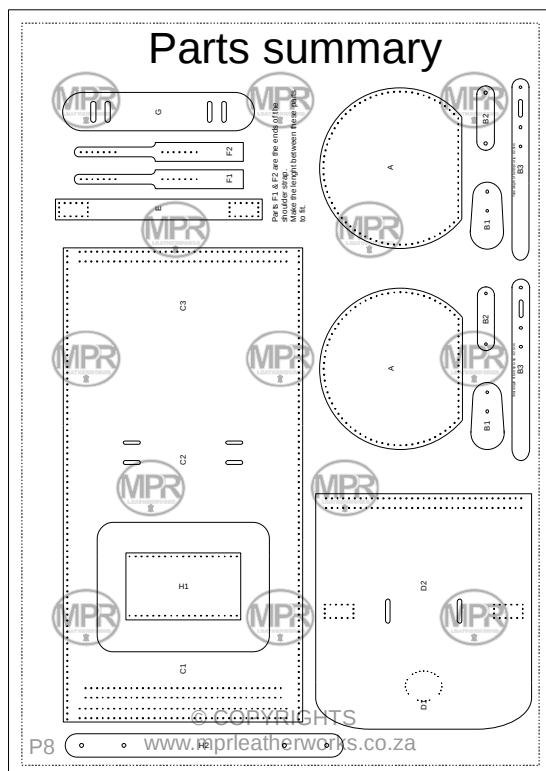
The Barrel bag was made with vegetable tanned top grain leather +-2.4mm (5-6oz) thickness.

The tools required for this build are:

- a) Printer to print Black & White PDF files onto A4 sized paper
- b) Stanley knife with sharp new blades
- c) Waxed thread 1mm and 2 (two) matching harness needles (it does not require sharp points)
- d) Leather hole punch 1.5mm & 4mm.
- e) Oblong punch - 25mm x 5mm & 18mm X 4mm
- f) Vegetable tanned leather with thickness of +-2.4mm (5-6oz) was used (Strongly recommended).
- g) Leather glue for logo, before you stitch.
- h) Buckles – 2 X 20mm
- i) D-rings – 2 X 30mm or if you prefer 2 X 25mm
- j) Tubular rivets – 6 x (9mm (L) with 9mm head)
- k) Trigger hooks – 2 X 15mm (w) length 65mm
- l) Patience, passion and a love for working with leather, of which I am sure you have more than enough!

Tips:

- 1) Take your time and prepare all the parts for this project before you start the assembly process.
- 2) Now carefully look at the pictures above to see where every part must go. It is actually very easy to build, and I cannot wait to see what your project looks like.

Printing the pattern:

Check out the – **Printer Setting Page**. The (yellow coloured circles) indicates which boxes must be checked to ensure that the correct printing size is selected, before you print the – **Test Page** - . **(This is very important)**
