EXPLODED VIEW OF A HANDBAG

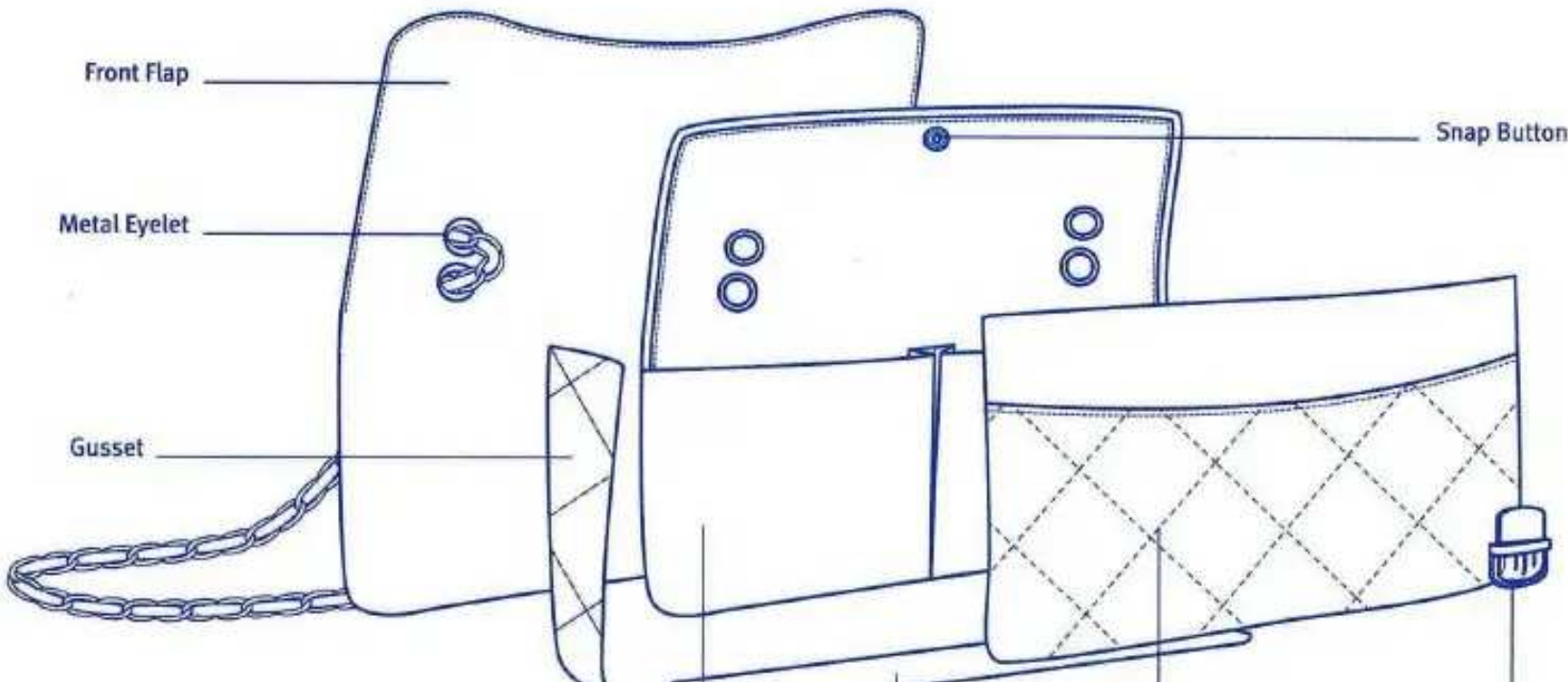

BAG MAKING TOOLS

GENERAL BAG MAKING TOOLS



Dressmaking Scissors

Scissors specifically for cutting fabric.



Pinking Shears

Reduces the bulk of the seam and stops raw edges of fabric from fraying.



Duckbill / Appliqué Scissors

The flat, semi-circular shaped blade is designed to hold backing fabric. It can reduce the bulk of bag seams.



Rotary Point Cutter

With its point cutter and rounded blade, it can easily cut tight corners for bags.



Finger Presser

Used for pressing seams, pleats and tucks.



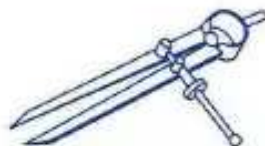
Loop Turner

A convenient tool for turning a fabric tube inside out to create a fabric strap.



Bodkin

It can be attached to a cord to quickly thread it through a fabric tube.



Compass

A measuring tool that can be opened to any required width and used to create a parallel line as a guide for cutting.



Thimble

Used for protecting the finger when hand-stitching.



Seam Ripper

Used for unpicking seams.



Pins

Used for keeping fabric together when sewing.



Hand-stitching Needle

Used for stitching in places where the sewing machine cannot reach.



Tailor's Chalk

Leaves marks before sewing.



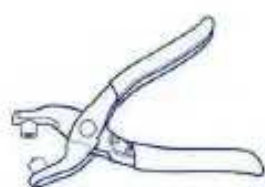
Hera Marker

Creates subtle creases on fabric for easy stitching.



Pliers (For Hardware)

Opens or closes metal hardware e.g. for attaching chains onto a handbag



Grommet Plier

Designed to insert metal rings or eyelets.



Saddler's Punch

Used for punching holes of different sizes in fabric.



Steam Iron

Used for making perfect seams with its high heat and steam.



Ironing Board

Together with the steam iron, it is used for making perfect seams.



Sleeve Ironing Board

Used for seam pressing at the later stages of bag making.



Fabric Glue

An alternative way for sticking pieces together when sewing is not an option.



Basting Tape

Holds seams together when sewing.



Quilt Ruler

Create marks on fabric when making quilted fabric.



Measuring Tape

A flexible tape made from a non-stretch material.



Steel Ruler

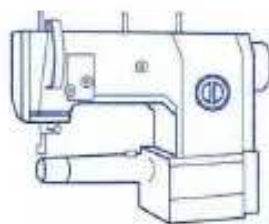
A ruler strong enough to retain a perfect straight edge for cutting.

SEWING MACHINES & MACHINE FEET



Flat-bed Sewing Machine

A must-have tool for bag making. It is a machine used for stitching fabric and other materials together with thread.



Cylinder Arm Sewing Machine

Once the bag takes on a shape, it gets harder to sew on a flat-bed machine. A cylinder arm machine would be a perfect alternative.



Even Feed Foot / Walking Foot

Used specifically for sewing multiple layers of fabric together.



Roller Foot

It has a roller attached and is used for sewing heavy seams or uneven surfaces.



Teflon / Leather Foot

Made of resin with a super smooth Teflon® coating on the sole of the foot, it is specifically used for sewing 'sticky' fabrics, e.g. leather, vinyl, PVC, suede, etc.



Piping Foot

The tunnel groove on the sole of the foot keeps the cords in position.



Zipper Foot

A foot used specifically for sewing zippers. It can be adjusted from left to right so the needle can stitch very close to the zipper.



1/4" Foot

Also known as a 'Patchwork foot', it has a built-in guide which keeps the fabric in exactly 1/4" position.



Free-motion Darning Foot

It gives maximum freedom for quilting or embroidering in any curve.



Clear Presser foot

Being transparent, it offers maximum visibility and control especially when working with intricate designs.

LEATHER BAG MAKING TOOLS



Scalpel

A cutting knife with a very sharp blade, used for pattern cutting.



All Purpose Leather Knife

A knife used as a skiver. Round beveled, hand sharpened edges.



Rotary Cutter

Comprising a circular blade that rotates, it is a practical tool for achieving both straight and curved lines. It can easily cut through multiple layers of fabrics, which cannot be done precisely with scissors.



Leather Scissors

A pair of super sharp blades for cutting lighter weight leather.



Self-healing Cutting Mat

A self-healing synthetic cutting surface used for pattern cutting.



Brush

Used for brushing rubber adhesive on leather.



Rolling Spreader

For applying uniform pressure to the surface of adhesive.



Adhesive

A rubber solution that is used for attaching leather / fabric.



Leather Edge Paint

Gives a pleasing finish to the edges of leather.



Common Edge Tool

Bevels and rounds off edges of straps and all soft leather.



Multi-hole Punch
A punch for punching holes of different sizes on leather.



Masking Tape
An adhesive tape with a slight stretch.



Awl
A pointed tool used for piercing patterns or materials to create location points as a guide for cutting or stitching.



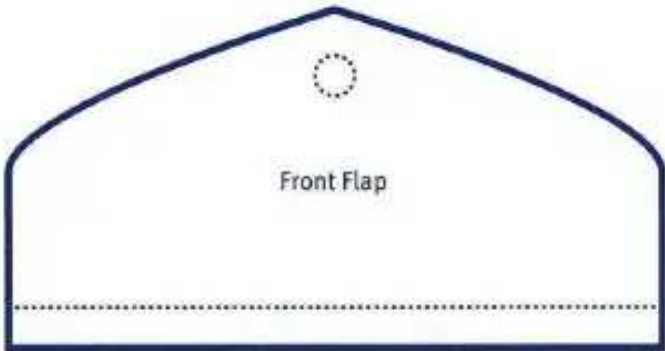
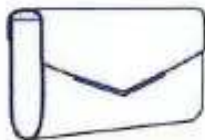
Glovers' Needle
Used for piercing and passing through tough materials such as leather, suede and vinyl without tearing.



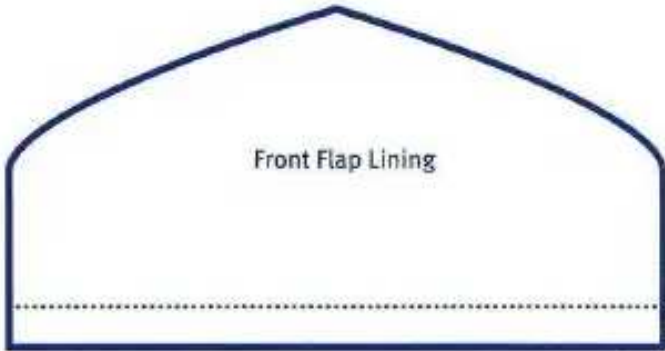

- A - Butt Best Value, 13% of the hide
- B - Bend Good Value, 30% of the hide
- C - Shoulder Fair Value, 32% of the hide
- D - Head, Belly Poor Value, 25% of the hide
- Grain line

COMMON TANNING METHODS

Vegetable-tanned leather

Vegetable-tanned leather is tanned using tannins and other ingredients found in different vegetable matter, such as tree bark prepared in bark mills, wood, leaves, fruits and roots and other similar sources.

Chrome-tanned leather

Also known as wet blue, chrome tanning is the most common tanning method due to its cost and time needed. It is more supple and pliable than vegetable-tanned leather and does not discolor or lose shape as drastically in water as vegetable-tanned leather. More esoteric colors can be dyed.

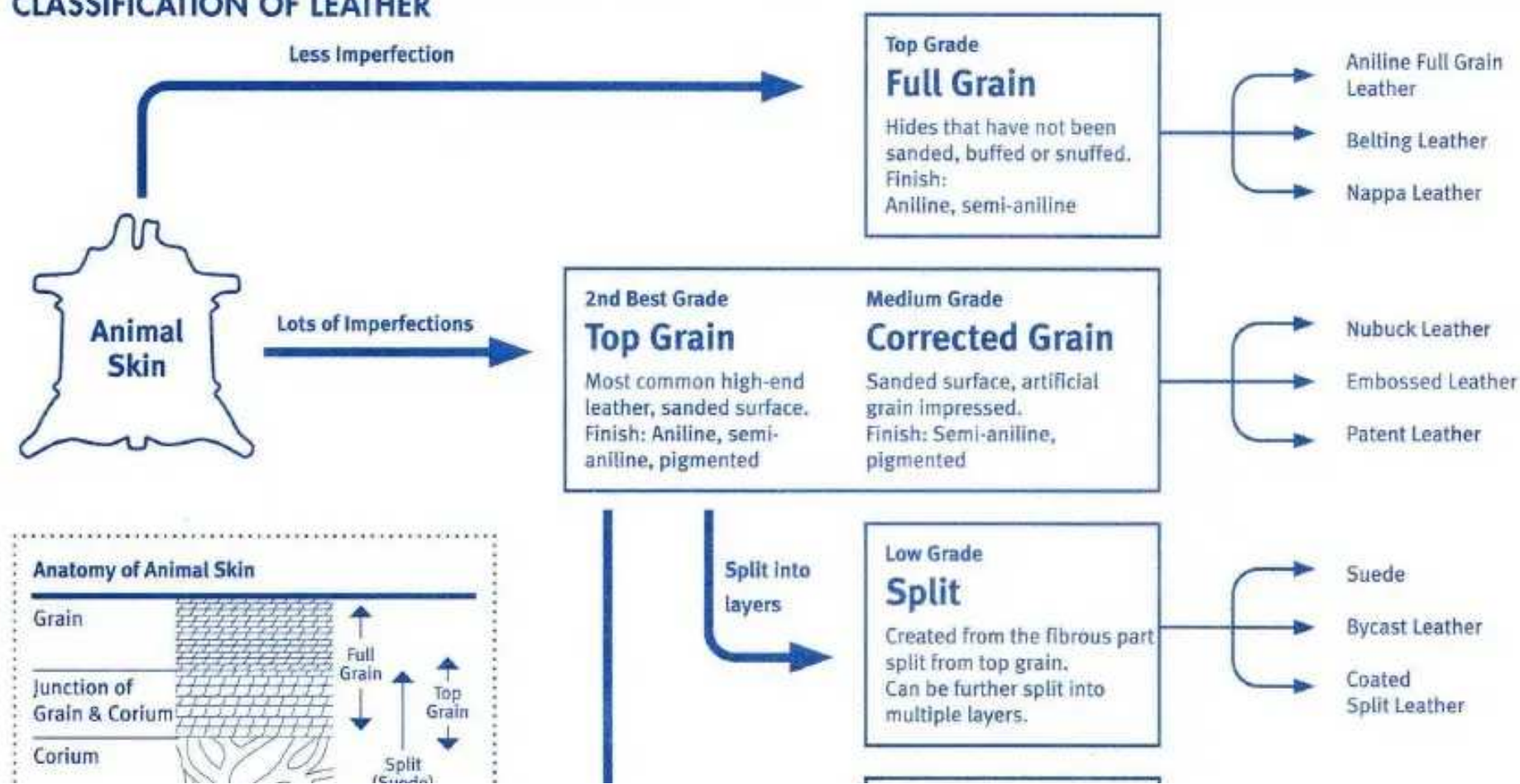
Aldehyde-tanned leather

Also known as wet white, aldehyde tanning uses glutaraldehyde or oxazolidine compounds. The leather is often seen in automobiles and shoes for infants.

Rawhide

Rawhide is made by soaking thin skin into lime and then stretching it while it is dry. It is stiffer and more brittle than other forms of leather. It can be cut into cord and made into shoelaces.

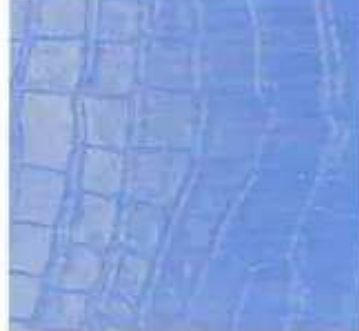

OSTRICH



One of the finest and most durable types of skins in the world. Unique bumpy texture. Flexible, pliable, durable and soft, very strong.

Usage: Bag shell material, favored by many major fashion houses such as Hermès, Prada, Gucci, and Louis Vuitton



KANGAROO



Very strong (10 times the tensile strength of cowhide and is 50% stronger than goatskin), thin, lightweight, uniform fiber structure.

Usage: High performance motorcycle leather



SALMON



Fine scales, pliable, strong and elegant looking. The most popular fish leather.

Usage: Wallets, handbag



PERCH



Sourced from the Nile. Thick, large and soft round scales.

Usage: Wallets, purses

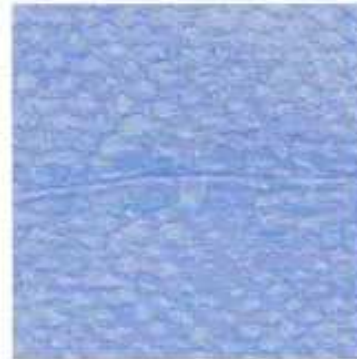


WOLFFISH



Smooth skin, scaleless. Easily recognizable thanks to its dark spots and 'stripes' which are due to the friction of marine rocks.

Usage: Belts, wallets



COD

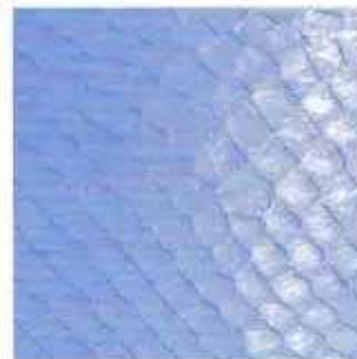


EEL

Distinctive pattern. Highly durable (25 times more durable than cowhide leather) and has a unique supple texture.

Usage: Bag shell material, wallets and belts



RABBIT



Small in size, thin and fragile.

Usage: Handbag shell material, decoration



LIZARD



Strong, lightweight, papery feel and thin.

Usage: Luxury bag shell material, decoration



HORSE



Tough, thin, non-uniform quality, stretches well. Commonly used for making shoes.

Usage: Bag shell material

COTTON CANVAS

An inexpensive heavyweight, rough woven cotton material.

Usage: Any type of bags, casual totes



CORDURA

An 'air-treated' rough nylon fabric originally designed by DuPont, famous for its water repellency, durability and abrasion resistance.

Usage: Backpacks, daypacks, functional bags



DENIM

Originally used in workwear or jeans, denim has a stone-washed effect that could be applied to the bag design.

Usage: Casual bags, backpacks



NYLON PACKCLOTH

A smooth and shiny nylon material that is slick to the touch.

Usage: Backpacks, functional bags



STRAW

One of the oldest materials for bag making, straw can be woven into bags.

Usage: Beach bags



RIPSTOP NYLON

With its signature 'grid' pattern, it is a lightweight nylon fabric famous for its resistance to tearing.

Usage: Backpacks, functional bags



PATENT LEATHER

Unlike standard leather, patent leather has a shiny mirror-like finish and comes in a wider variety of colors.

Usage: Medium priced bags or other small leather goods



BALLISTIC NYLON

A thick and durable synthetic nylon fabric which is very easy to clean.

Usage: Softside luggage, backpacks, functional bags



FAUX LEATHER

Most commonly made of plastic, it is not as durable as real leather, but it is water-resistant. It has a broader color range than real leather since it is a man-made leather.

Usage: Low to medium priced bags or other small leather goods



PVC FABRIC

A durable and colorful fabric that can be used to add color, durability and waterproof properties.

Usage: Wash bags, waterproof bag, decoration



SUEDE

It is made from the underside of animal skin, and is not as durable as standard leather. Unlike leather, suede tends to absorb liquids readily, and therefore stains easily.

Usage: Medium priced bags



MESH FABRIC

Mostly made of nylon or polyester, it is lightweight, thin, strong, and is available in a wide variety of styles.

Usage: Functional bags, decoration

STABILIZER / INTERFACING FOR BAGS



COTTON / POLYESTER BATTING

Made with glue or bonding adhesive, it is used as a layer of insulation between fabrics, and can be used in quilt making. It adds warmth and a heavy touch to the fabric.

Usage: Luxury handbags, quilted bags



SPUNLACE FABRIC

Spunlacing uses high-speed jets of water so the fibers get knotted to one another and form the fabric shape. It is always used as the backing of PVC leather for keeping the shape of the fabric.

Usage: Low to medium priced bags, PVC leather



WOVEN / NONWOVEN INTERFACING

Fusible or sew-in interfacing are often used in bag making for adding stiffness and keeping the bag in shape.

Usage: Any type of bags



REGENERATED LEATHER FIBERBOARD

Also known as 'bonded leather', it is made of the wasted part of the leather. Has high elasticity, strength and water resistance.

Usage: Luxury handbags



EVA FOAM PADDING

Ethylene-vinyl acetate (EVA), also known as ‘expanded rubber’ or ‘foam rubber’, is popular for its shock absorption. It is often used as the middle layer of backpack straps.

Usage: Backpack straps



PVC COATING

Instead of adding an extra layer of stabilizer, PVC coating on the surface of the fabric could make it waterproof and resistant to dirt, mildew, oil and UV rays, and can also increase the stability and strength of the bag.

Usage: Backpacks, functional bags, casual totes

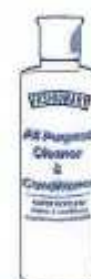

Shine Cloth

The cloth brings up a brilliant shine after polishing and spit shining.

The brush can spread shoe polish evenly and thoroughly.

Microfiber Cloth

When there is no water or soap, a microfiber cloth works great on removing oil and dirt.

ALUMINUM LUGGAGE CARE

Cold Water
Microfiber Cloth
Brake Cleaner



Mix cold water with a few drops of liquid soap. Dip a microfiber cloth in the soapy water and wring out the excess moisture.



Remove any dirt/mud/salt with the damp cloth. Wait until dry.



Use brake cleaner to clean the dirt inside the scratches.

REMOVING MOLD ON A BAG

Tools required:

Cold Water
1:1 Vinegar & Water
Microfiber Cloth



Wet the microfiber cloth and rub the moldy area on the bag until it is clean.

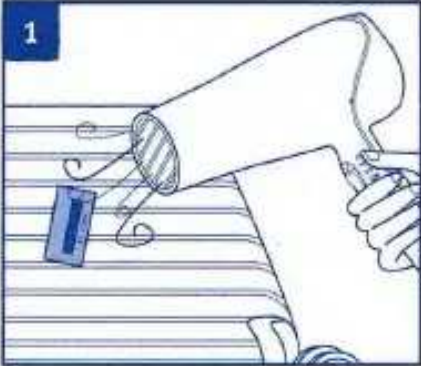

Accordion	/ A type of internal construction found in handbags and briefcases, where the compartment folds open like accordion bellows.	Daypack	commuting. / A backpack of small or medium size intended for day use. Lighter and more compact, they are suitable for school, short hikes, or for daily errand runs.
Aniline Leather	/ A kind of leather dyed with soluble dyes so that it retains the original hide's skin structure and natural characteristics, such as the 'grain' texture on the surface.	Diaper Bag	/ A type of bag designed to carry everything needed to take care of a baby. A diaper bag typically comprises multiple compartments and pockets, while some have extra features such as matching changing pads.
Appliqué	/ Elements applied to a bag's surface for decorative purposes. These may include embroidery, beads, sequins, hardware, colored fabric or leather.	Doctor's Bag	/ Originally used by physicians, traditional doctor's bags were constructed from leather and featured a split handle which opened from the top. Modernized versions come in a variety of different materials and designs, such as multiple pockets and pouches, and may be fastened with a zipper or hook-and-loop closure.
Attaché Case	/ A typically boxy, hard-sided, hinged briefcase used for carrying papers and documents.	Dopp Kit	/ A travel-friendly toiletry bag for men to store their grooming tools and personal sundries, such as razors, shaving cream, toothbrush and toothpaste, deodorant, combs, shampoo, scissors, cologne, etc.
Backpack	/ A large bag used for carrying items on the back, the backpack was given its name in the 1910's in the USA. Backpacks are particularly popular for outdoor activities, such as camping or hiking.	Drawstring Handbag Duffel	/ A bag that is cinched closed by a drawstring or drawcord. / Alternatively spelt 'Duffie', a duffel is a cylindrical bag with top handles and a spacious compartment. Duffels are highly versatile and practical, and can be used as cabin luggage, checked baggage, gym bags or sports bags. They sometimes come with extra features such as wheels and shoulder straps.

Belt Bag	/ Also known as a 'waist pack', a belt bag is a type of purse attached to a belt, designed to be worn around the waist. The bag is sometimes detachable from the belt.	Feet	/ Metal or plastic knobs attached to the base of a bag to allow it to stand on its own when not in use. Also called protective feet, they elevate the bag off the ground thus
Bi-fold Wallet	/ A wallet folded into two halves with a center fold. Banknotes are folded over while cards can be stored vertically or horizontally.		
Box Bag	/ A type of hard, boxy shaped handbag.		
Briefcase	/ A rectangular case made of leather, manmade materials or plastic, used for holding documents and books. It is carried with a top handle.		
Bucket Bag	/ A bag with a rounded base and drawstring cinched opening, thus named due to its bucket-like shape. Its height is usually greater than its width.		

Camera Bag	/ A padded bag with specially designed compartments to hold and protect photography equipment, such as cameras and accessories.	Flap Bag	protecting the base from dirt, moisture and scrapes.
Canteen Bag	/ Named after the traditional water bottle used by hikers and soldiers known as a ‘canteen’, a canteen bag is a stiff, round-shaped bag that usually comes with a shoulder strap.	Full Grain Leather	/ A pouch or bag that closes with a folding flap. / Leather that has been specially tanned to retain the appearance and visibility of the natural texture, known as ‘grain’, of the original hide.
Canvas	/ Made from either natural or synthetic fibers or a blend of the two, canvas is a versatile, low-cost and durable textile that can be heavy or light in weight.	Garment Bag	/ A bag used for protecting garments, in particular suits and dresses, during transit or travel. Extra features may include shoe pockets and toiletry pockets.
Carry-on Luggage Cabin Luggage	/ Bags or cases of the perfect size to be carried on board flights and which would fit in the cabin’s overhead storage locker. They come in various forms ranging from totes, suitcases, duffels to backpacks. While most are designed to meet cabin requirements, passengers are advised to check in advance whether their bag’s measurements comply with the airline’s baggage rules.	Gig Bag / Guitar Bag	/ A bag constructed with protective padding and soft sides, designed to store, protect and carry musical instruments, especially guitars or bass guitars.

North South (or N/S)	/ Describes a bag that is vertical in shape, with a height greater than its width.	Top Grain Leather	/ Leather is always divided into multiple layers before use, amongst which top grain leather is the topmost layer.
Nubuck	/ A type of soft aniline leather which has been brushed, buffed or sanded to create a suede-like texture. Due to its napped surface, it is easily stained even after being treated with stain protection.	Top Handle	/ A handle attached to the top of bag allowing it to be carried by hand.
Nylon	/ Nylon is regarded as the strongest synthetic textile, known for its high resistance to abrasion and stains. It is commonly used in tote bags due to its durable nature.	Top Zip Bag	/ A bag whose compartment can be closed by a zipper at the top.
One Strap Bookbag	/ A single-strapped backpack meant to be carried on one	Tote	/ A large bag typically with an unfastened open-top compartment and parallel double top handles.
		TSA Lock	/ A TSA lock is specially designed for TSA baggage checks

Open Pocket	/ A pocket that is open at the top and does not have a fastening or closure.
Packing Cube	/ A cuboid-shaped zipper case designed for storing and protecting garments, shoes and other items when traveling. Packing cubes keep items tidy and well-organized within a suitcase and effectively prevent clothing from getting creased.
Padlock	/ Opened and locked with a key, a padlock is a portable locking device with a pivotable shackle which can be inserted through an opening on a gate, locker door, suitcase, etc., to protect the valuables within.
Patent Leather Portfolio Bag	/ A type of leather with a glossy, high-shine finish. / A large flat case used by artists, designers and students to carry items such as drawings, paper or photographs. It prevents the content within from getting folded or creased.
Purse Hook / Purse Hanger	/ A device used for temporarily suspending your handbag from a table to prevent theft and to protect it from dust and dirt on the floor. It features a flat pad which rests on the tabletop, and a hook for holding the handbag.
Quilted Handbag	/ A handbag made from quilted fabric with a decorative topstitched pattern.
Randoseru	/ A distinct type of backpack used by Japanese elementary school students. Made from stitched sturdy leather or synthetic leather, it typically features a flap cover and a boxy, firm-sided construction, designed to be durable as schoolchildren usually use the same bag for six years. The name is a loanword which originated from the Dutch word 'ransel', which means 'backpack'.
Rivet	/ A metal pin that is used for binding two sheets of material, such as leather or metal, together or purely for decoration. Flat and larger on one end (the head), it has a cylindrical shaft at the other end which is inserted through the material then hammered to form a flat head, as a result keeping the material secured in place.
Rucksack	/ An alternative name for 'backpack' mainly used in the UK

TSA stands for Transport Security Administration, an agency of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security which has the authority to screen every passenger's baggage before it can board an aircraft. At their discretion, TSA may choose to open a passenger's checked baggage for closer inspection. If a suitcase selected for inspection uses a regular lock instead of a TSA lock, it will be destroyed by TSA in order to gain access.

/ A wallet folded into three sections with two folds. Cards are usually stored vertically in a tri-fold wallet.

/ Alternatively known as a travel trunk, a trunk is a boxy shaped container designed to hold items of clothing and other personal belongings when traveling. Trunks can come in different sizes, varying from 30-36 inches in length, 16-22 inches in width and various heights.

/ A type of bag worn around the waist to hold smaller objects and minimal essentials. It is especially useful as it keeps the wearer hands-free during travel, jogging or hiking.

/ A small, flat case used for holding money, credit cards, personal identification documents, business cards, etc. Typically made from leather or textile, wallets come in both foldable and non-folded variations and are usually compact enough to fit in the pocket. Women's wallets are commonly called 'purse' in British English, while Americans often refer to the folded wallet as a 'billfold'.

/ Generally with a rectangular base, a weekender or holdall is a large leather or fabric bag fastened with a top zipper. It is usually spacious enough to hold personal contents for a short weekend trip.

/ A wallet or clutch with a loop-shaped wristlet strap designed to be worn around the wrist.

/ The tab attached to the slider of a zipper which can be used to pull the zipper open.
