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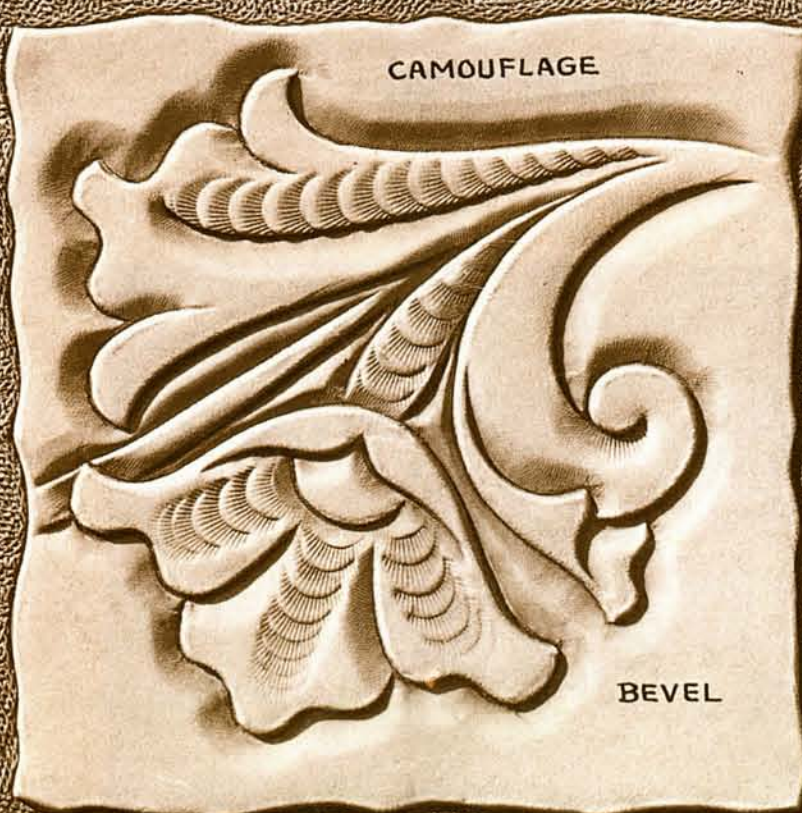

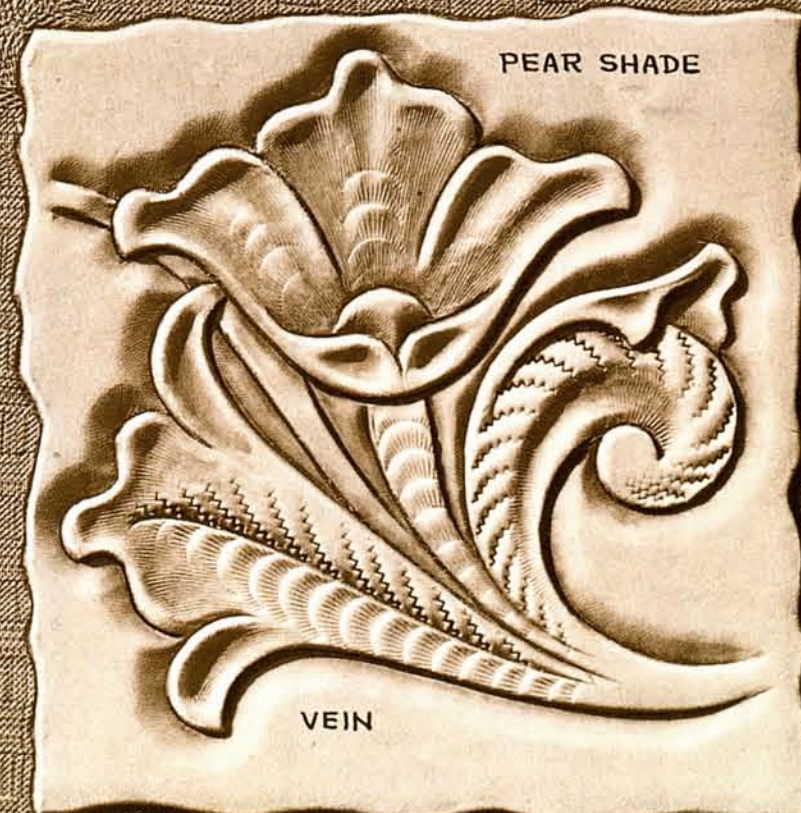

About the cover...

Geometric Stamp No. G548 was used around the border. The lettering: (Crafttool - by Al Stohlman) was done in the Silhouette technique. The Lettering: (Tech-Tips) was done in part with the double beveler as suggested on page 14. The background was done with tools: A800 - A888 - A105. Stamping tools used on the design at bottom: Camouflage C940 - Beveler B198 - Veiner V402 & V403 - Pear Shaders P207 & P703. Use a rule or straight edge to cut the straight border lines. To make the border stamp come out even at the corners, slight "fudging" is sometimes required on the spacing. This is done by stamping the impressions across about halfway, then use your hand to lightly imprint the impressions to insure the proper spacing.

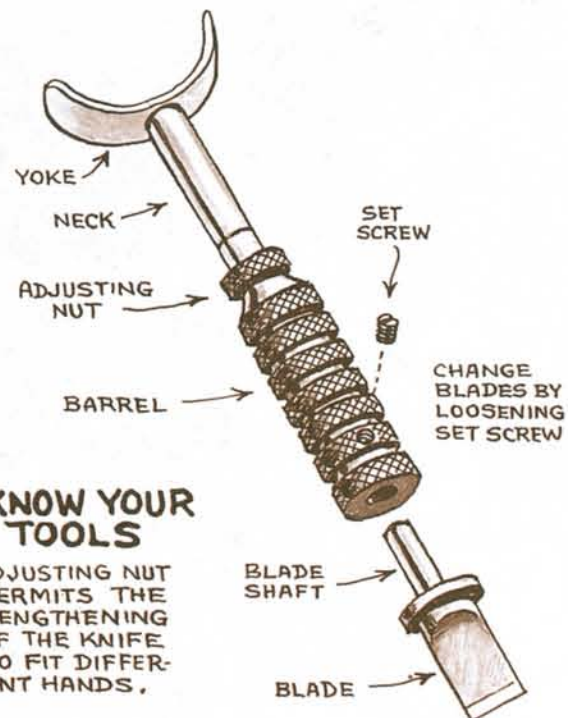

The SWIVEL KNIFE

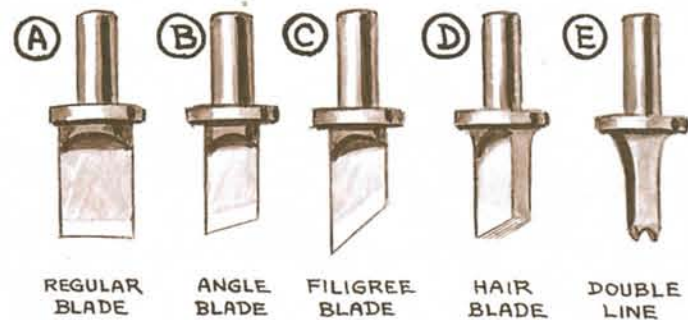


THE SWIVEL KNIFE... IS PERHAPS THE MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL OF THE LEATHER CARVING TOOLS. THIS IS THE TOOL THAT CUTS THE OUTLINE OF THE DESIGN, SO THAT THE STAMPING TOOLS CAN BRING IT INTO THREE DIMENSIONAL RELIEF. THE SWIVEL KNIFE BLADE ALSO ADDS THE DECORATIVE CUTTING THAT ENHANCES THE DESIGN.... AND ADDS THE FINAL DETAILS. SWIVEL KNIVES ARE AVAILABLE IN SEVERAL STYLES.

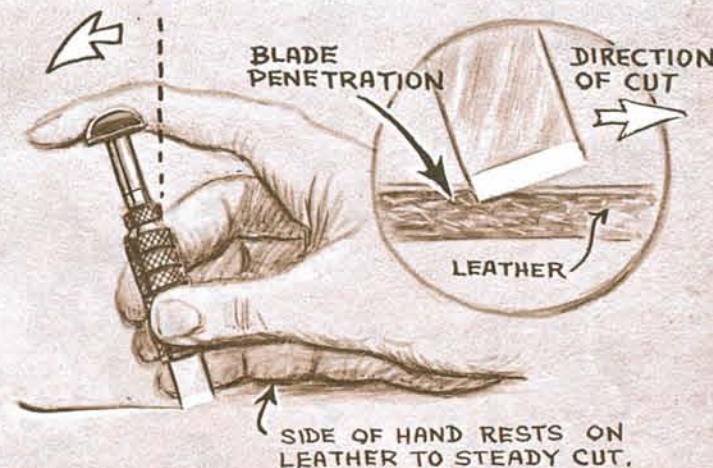


KNOW YOUR TOOLS

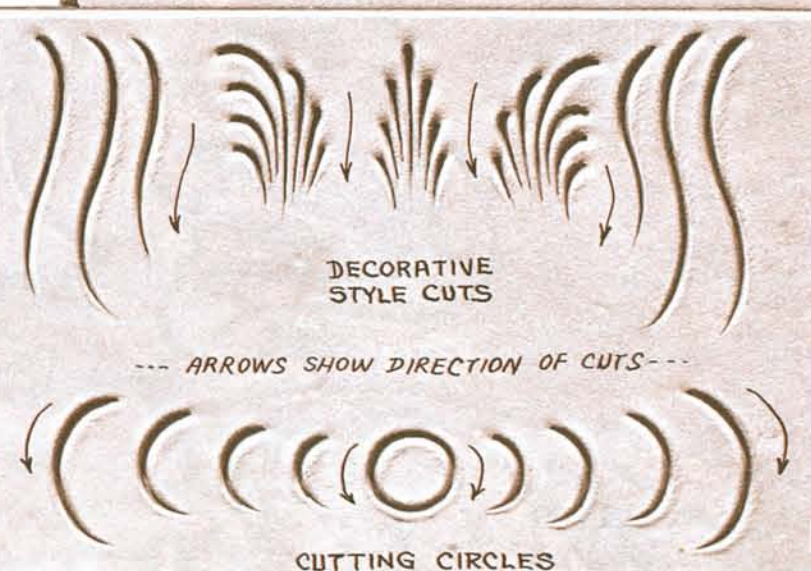
ADJUSTING NUT PERMITS THE LENGTHENING OF THE KNIFE TO FIT DIFFERENT HANDS.



CRAFTOOL SWIVEL KNIFE BLADES ARE AVAILABLE IN A WIDE VARIETY OF FORMS.... TO SERVE ALMOST EVERY CUTTING AND DECORATIVE NEED. STUDY THE SUGGESTIONS PRESENTED AND USE THE BLADES THAT ARE DESIGNED FOR EACH SPECIFIC PURPOSE.



HOLD KNIFE AS SHOWN ABOVE. TIP FORWARD SO POINT OF BLADE CAN PENETRATE THE LEATHER. DOWNWARD PRESSURE WITH YOKE FINGER IS REQUIRED. TO CUT CURVES, ROTATE BARREL IN THUMB AND FINGERS. PRACTICE THE CUTS SHOWN BELOW, ON SCRAPS. PRACTICE, PRACTICE - PRACTICE!

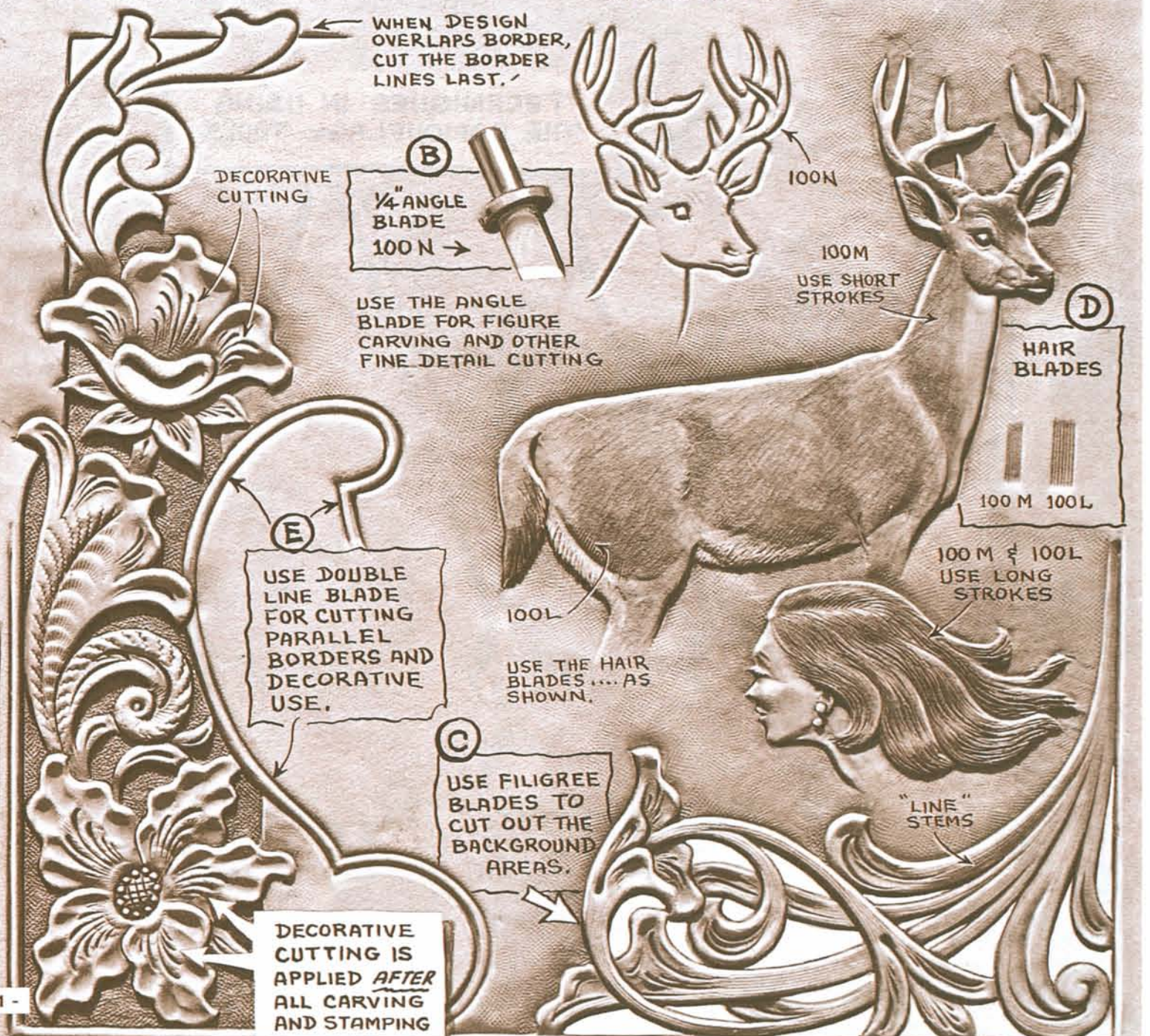
CUT BORDER LINES FIRST. USE A STRAIGHT EDGE AS A GUIDE. NOTE HOW BLADE IS PULLED FROM LEATHER JUST BEFORE DESIGN LINES TOUCH THE BORDER LINES.



WRONG

IMPROPER CUTS ARE SHOWN BY ARROWS... No. 1. DO NOT UNDERCUT! THIS IS CAUSED BY LEANING THE BLADE TO LEFT OR RIGHT... SHOWN BY ARROWS... No. 2.

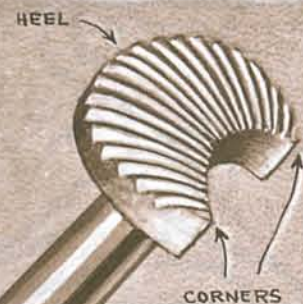

CRAFTOOL No. P206 IS A GOOD ALL-AROUND SHADER AND PRACTICAL FOR MANY SHADING NEEDS.

1 SMOOTH LINED RIBBED CHECKED

PEAR SHADERS ARE AVAILABLE WITH THE FOUR SURFACES SHOWN ABOVE. THE REASON FOR THESE DIFFERENCES IS TO CREATE CONTRASTS AND FOR SPECIAL EFFECTS. STUDY SOME OF THE EXAMPLES.

WHAT IS A PEAR SHADER USED FOR...

THE PEAR SHADER IS USED TO DEPRESS CERTAIN AREAS OF A DESIGN TO GIVE MORE DEPTH, ADD CONTOUR, AND TO CREATE A MORE REALISTIC APPEARANCE. EXAMPLE AT RIGHT SHOWS SHADING OF FLOWER PETALS.

1 SPECIAL EFFECTS...STUDY THE FLOWERS AT LEFT.... AND NOTE THE EFFECTS OF THE DIFFERENT TEXTURED TOOLS. SELECTION OF SHADERS IS USUALLY A PERSONAL CHOICE, AND ONE TOOL CAN USUALLY BE SUBSTITUTED FOR ANOTHER.... IF DESIRED.



SMOOTH.....NOTE THE BURNISHING EFFECT IS NOT AS DARK AS TOOLS USED BELOW



LINED.....NOTE HOW THE LINES RUN TOWARD THE FLOWER CENTER

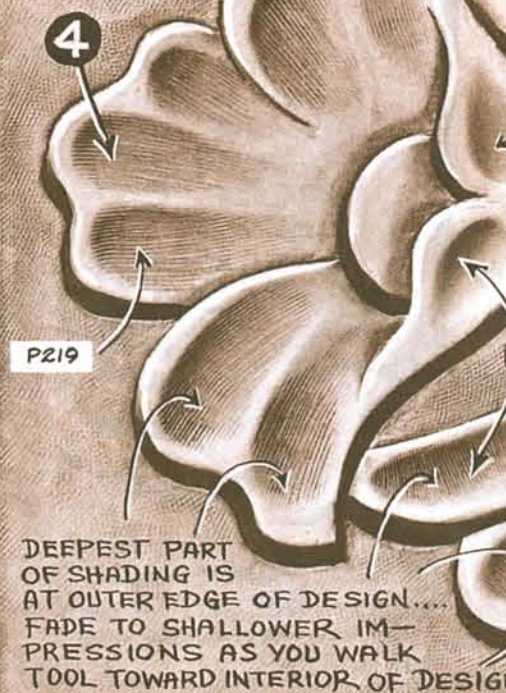


RIBBED.....NOTE HOW THESE TOOLS BURNISH MORE THAN NO. P206

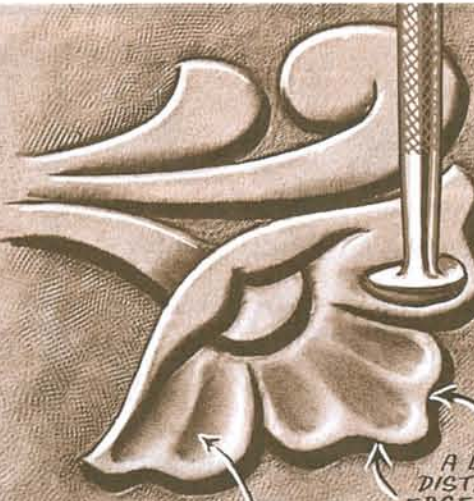


CHECKED

4 BURNISHING..... PROPERLY CASED (MOISTENED) LEATHER IS REQUIRED FOR GOOD BURNISHING (DARKENING) EFFECTS. EXPERIENCE IS YOUR BEST TEACHER. PRACTICE ON SCRAPS OF LEATHER WITH VARYING DEGREES OF MOISTURE CONTENT.



DEEPEST PART OF SHADING IS AT OUTER EDGE OF DESIGN.... FADE TO SHALLOWER IMPRESSIONS AS YOU WALK TOOL TOWARD INTERIOR OF DESIGN



NOTE: MAINTAIN A UNIFORM DISTANCE FROM EDGE OF DESIGN

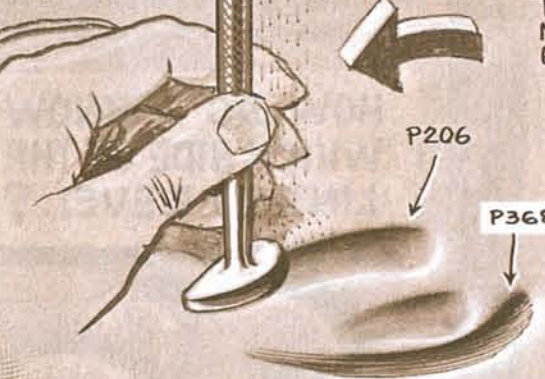

THE SHADERS ARE USUALLY HELD PERPENDICULAR WHEN USED. STRIKE THE TOOL FIRMLY FOR DEEPEST IMPRESSIONS. TAP THE TOOL LIGHTLY FOR FAINT IMPRESSIONS.

2 WALKING THE TOOL..... THE BEST SHADING RESULTS ARE OBTAINED BY "WALKING" THE TOOL. THIS IS ACCOMPLISHED BY MOVING THE SHADER SLIGHTLY AFTER EACH BLOW OF MALLET, STRIKING AND MOVING THE TOOL IN A RHYTHMICAL... SIMULTANEOUS MOTION WITH THE BLOWS OF THE MALLET. PRACTICE..... "WALKING" AND "FADING" OUT IMPRESSIONS AS SHOWN AT LEFT.

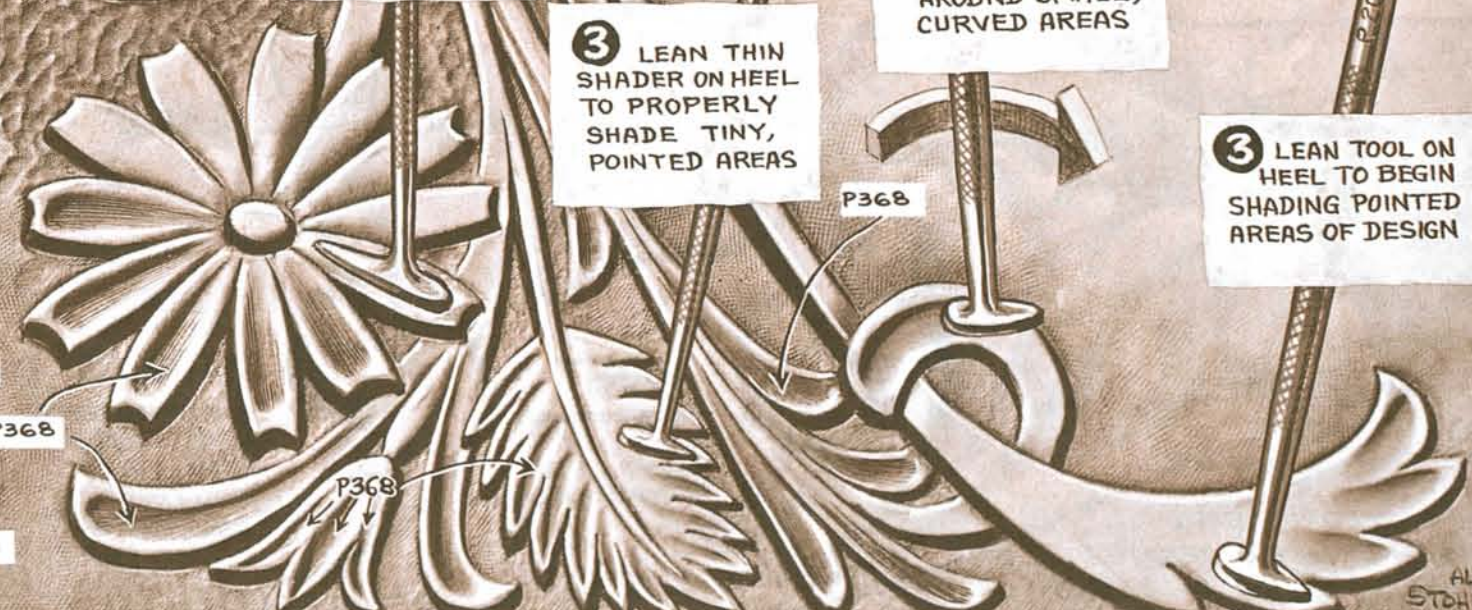

THE BEVELER WAS DESIGNED TO BRING THE PATTERN, OR DESIGN, INTO THREE DIMENSIONAL RELIEF. THESE TOOLS ARE USED IN ALL FORMS OF LEATHER CARVING. THE BEVELER IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT OF ALL TOOLS.

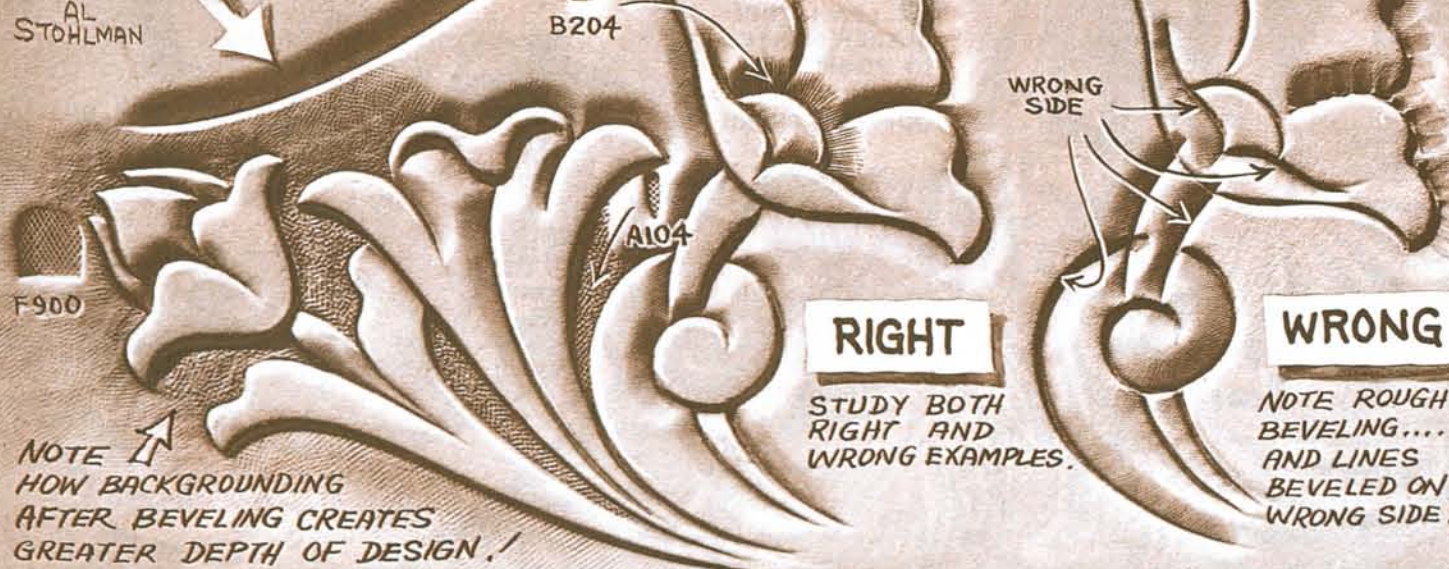

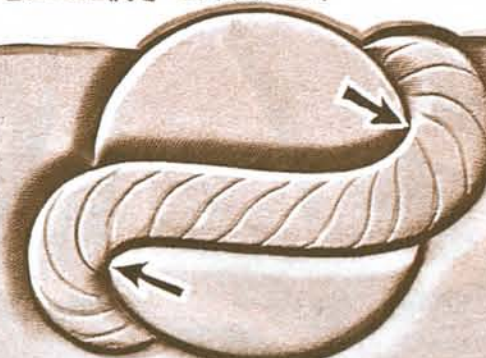

3 CHANGING THE POINT OF BEVEL

OFTEN TIMES, TO CREATE THE PROPER EFFECT, IT IS NECESSARY TO CHANGE THE BEVELING FROM ONE SIDE OF THE LINE TO THE OTHER... AS SHOWN BELOW WITH THE ROPE AND SPHERE, AND ROSE AT RIGHT. ARROWS SHOW POINT OF BEVELING CHANGE.



THE ROSE IS A FINE EXAMPLE OF THE BEVELING CHANGE FROM ONE SIDE OF THE LINE TO THE OTHER TO ACHIEVE THE PROPER EFFECTS. ARROWS SHOW POINT OF CHANGE.

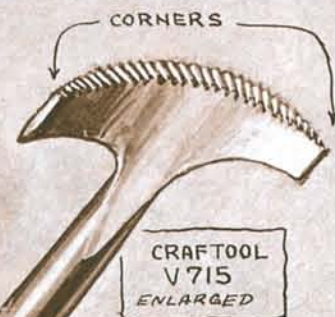

SEEDERS

SEEDERS ARE USUALLY HELD IN A PERPENDICULAR POSITION WHEN STRUCK WITH THE MALLET. OFTEN TIMES...ONLY A HALF IMPRESSION IS DESIRED. AT SUCH TIMES, THE TOOL MUST BE LEANED EXTREMELY TO ONE SIDE OR THE OTHER.

SINCE THIS PAGE FEATURES THE SEEDERS, YOU WILL NOTE THAT MOST OF THE DESIGNS ARE NOT FULLY STAMPED. STAMPING OPERATIONS ARE SHOWN ON THE PRECEDING TIPS. SEEDING IS USUALLY DONE AFTER ALL SHADING AND BEVELING. SEE LUCKY 7 INSTRUCTION BOOK FOR SUGGESTED ORDER.

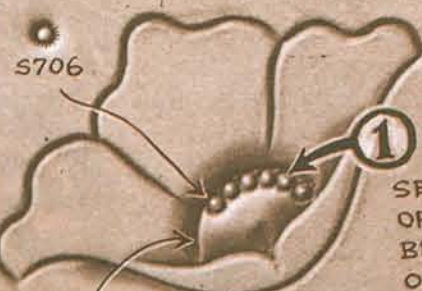

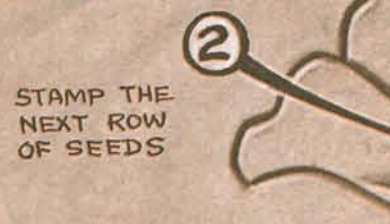

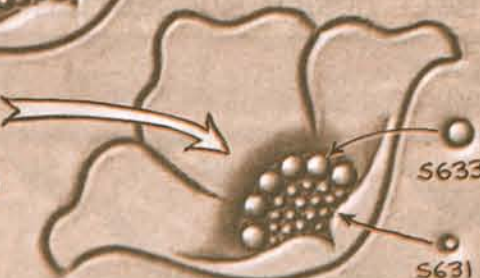

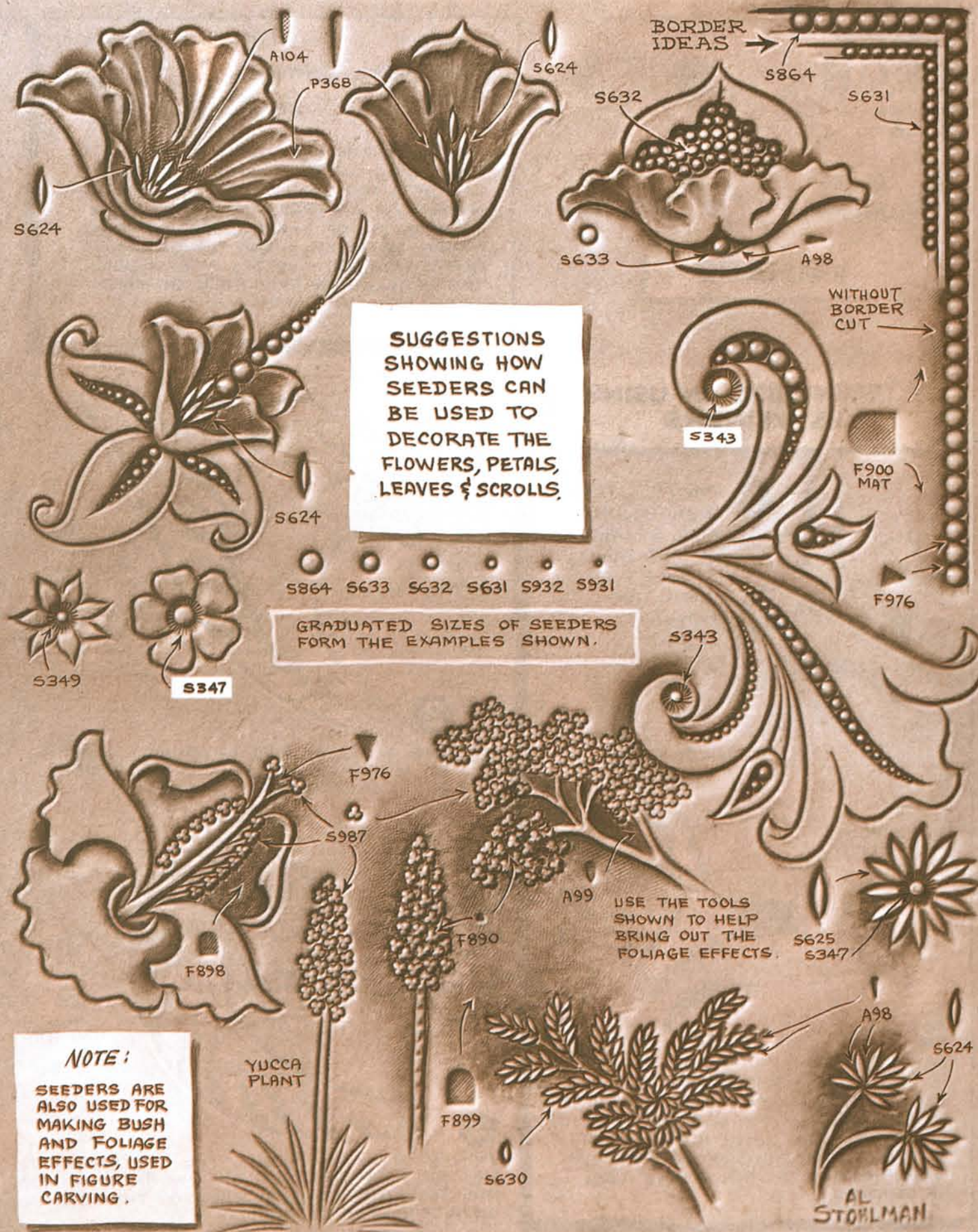

THE PURPOSE OF THE BACKGROUND TOOLS IS TO DEPRESS THE BACKGROUND AREAS OF A DESIGN SO THAT THE DESIGN ITSELF APPEARS RAISED. THE BACKGROUND TOOLS ARE USUALLY USED LAST... AFTER ALL BEVELING AND OTHER STAMPING HAS BEEN COMPLETED. THE EXAMPLES HERE SHOW ONLY THE DESIGNS BEVELED, TO MORE CLEARLY ILLUSTRATE BACKGROUND EFFECTS.

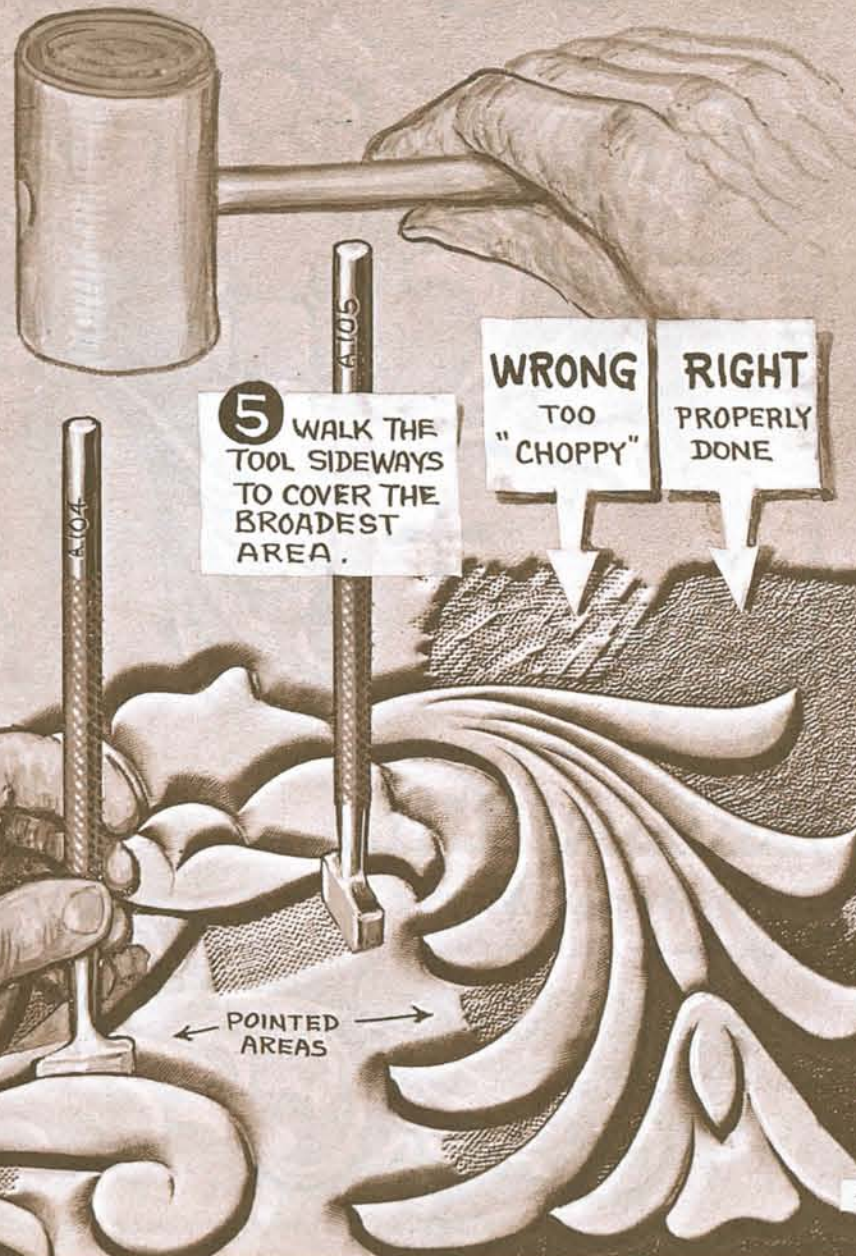
CRAFTOOL No. A104 IS A GOOD ALL-AROUND BACKGROUNDER. ONE END IS POINTED FOR SMALL AREAS, AND MATTED AREAS CAN BE GONE OVER, IF NECESSARY, FOR A MORE UNIFORM DEPTH AND EVEN APPEARANCE.

THE BACKGROUND TOOLS ARE USUALLY HELD STRAIGHT UP AND DOWN WHEN USED. STRIKE THE TOOL FIRMLY FOR CLEAR IMPRESSIONS. HOWEVER, CAUTION MUST BE USED SO AS NOT TO STRIKE THEM TOO HARD, OR THEY WILL GO THRU THE LEATHER. USE UNIFORM BLOWS OF THE MALLET FOR UNIFORM BACKGROUNDING DEPTH.

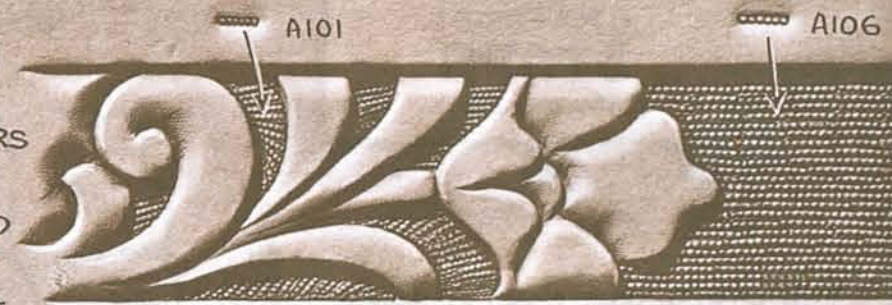

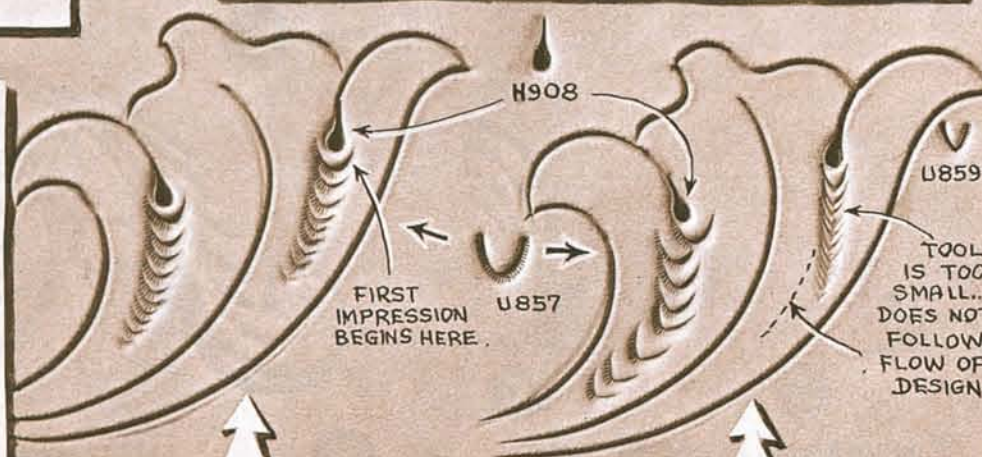
CRAFTTOOL MULEFOOT (ENLARGED)

THE MULEFOOT TOOL IS USED FOR MANY DECORATIVE PURPOSES. ONE OF THE COMMON USES IS IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE "STOPS" (TECH-TIP No. 9). STUDY THE SUGGESTIONS AT RIGHT, AND NOTICE HOW THE MULEFOOT ENHANCES THE FLOW OF THE DESIGN. PROPER USE OF THESE TOOLS WILL TAKE SOME PRACTICE. THE FIRST IMPRESSION (NEXT TO STOP) SHOULD BE THE DEEPEST. STRIKE THE TOOL FIRMLY, BUT NOT TOO HARD. LEAN THE TOOL SLIGHTLY TOWARDS THE POINT TO DIMINISH THE SIZE OF THE IMPRESSION. NOTICE THE RIGHT AND WRONG EXAMPLES.

THE PATTERN AT RIGHT IS TAKEN FROM TECH-TIP No. 9... USING "STOPS". SINCE THE MULEFOOT IS USUALLY USED IN CONNECTION WITH THE STOPS... THE MULEFOOT IS SHOWN HERE... PROPERLY USED. USE THE STYLE OF MULEFOOT OF YOUR CHOICE.

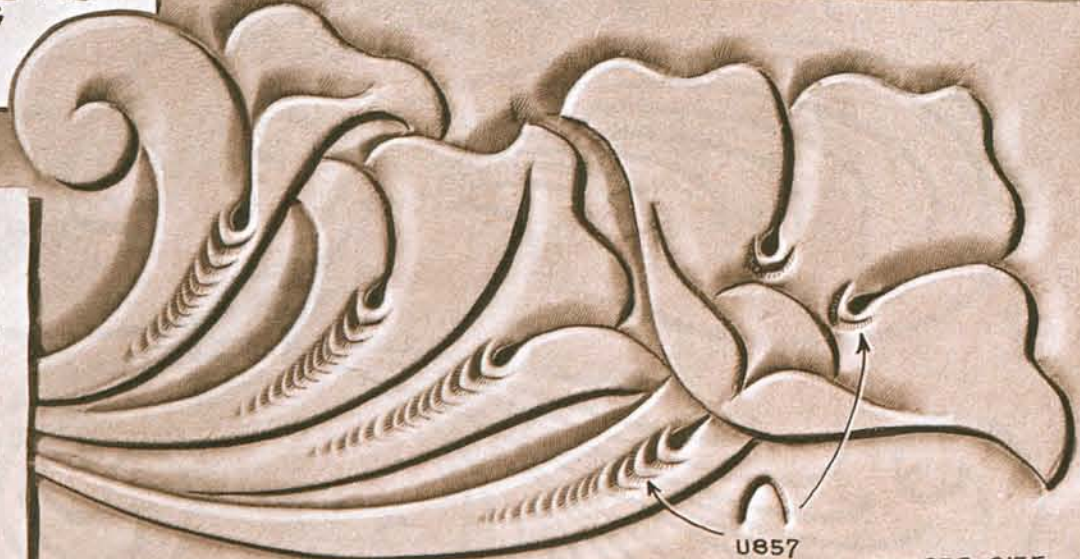

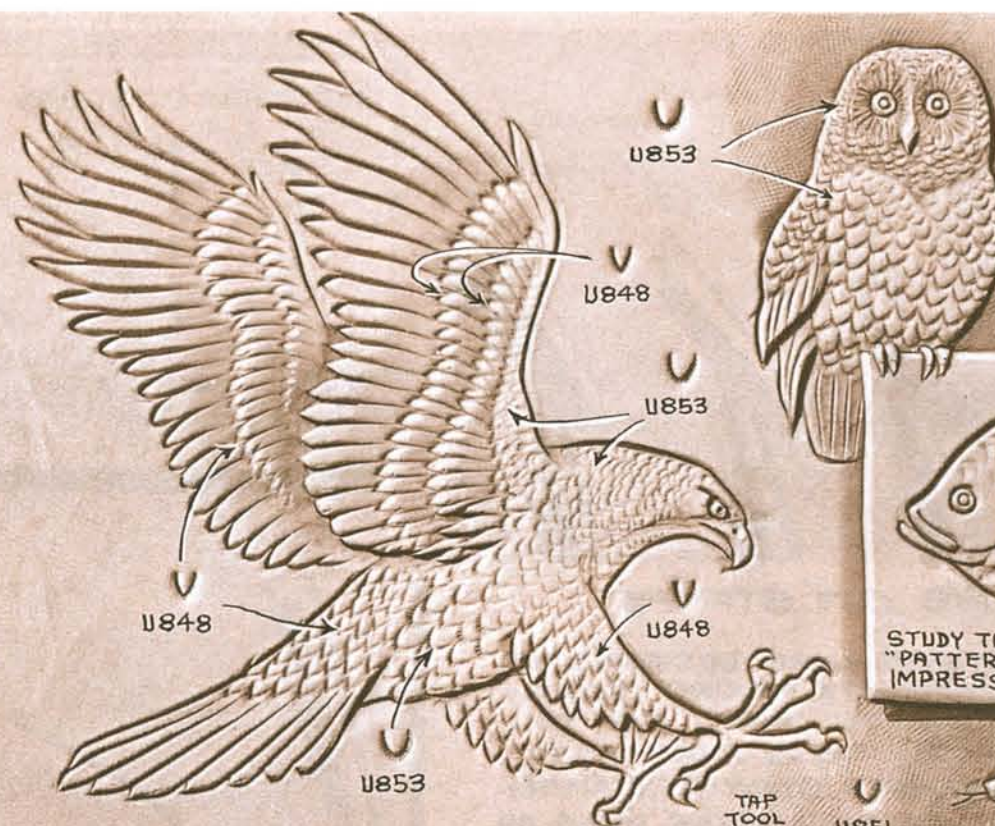
