FAQs

Q: Can I sell what I make from these patterns?

A: *Of course you can! In fact, we encourage it!*

Q: Can I sell my copy of the pattern?

A: *No you can't. You can't reproduce the pattern in any media, be it digital or physical, to **sell** without written permission from us. You **CAN** print one (1) copy at a time for your personal use.*

Q: I don't have a printer. How can I print my pattern?

A: *You can take it your local office supply or print shop. They will print for a small fee per page. The print shop may ask if you are authorized to print from this file. You are allowed to print one (1) copy for your personal use.*

Q: I'm not in the US, and the paper used here is a different size. How will this affect the pattern when I print it out?

A: *We have allowed a generous overlap on the patterns pieces that require more than one sheet to create a full size pattern. There may be occasions that the pattern will print outside the width of a sheet of A4 paper. If you look at the pattern piece on the screen, and it goes from edge to edge width-wise, cut a strip of paper 2" (roughly 5 cm) wide, and either glue or tape it to the edge of the A4 paper, overlapping it a bit, to make it 8.5" (21.59 cm) wide. Length is not an issue, as A4 paper is longer than the standard 8.5 X 11" paper used in the States.*

Assembly

Sew one "flap" flap to the front cover, and one to the back cover, with the long side (with the 1/4" holes) facing out, using a saddle stitch.

With front cover grain side up, insert Chicago screw shaft in front cover "flap" flap with the head of the screw on the inside and the open end of the shaft facing up.

Cut and trim paper (see patterns for paper dimensions)

Punch out holes with paper punch

Add paper until even with the corner shaft opening

With back cover flap side up, lay it on top of the front cover (covers will be facing grain side to grain side), lay the back cover "flap" flap over the screw shafts and insert the Chicago screw. Tighten

Flip both pieces over and close

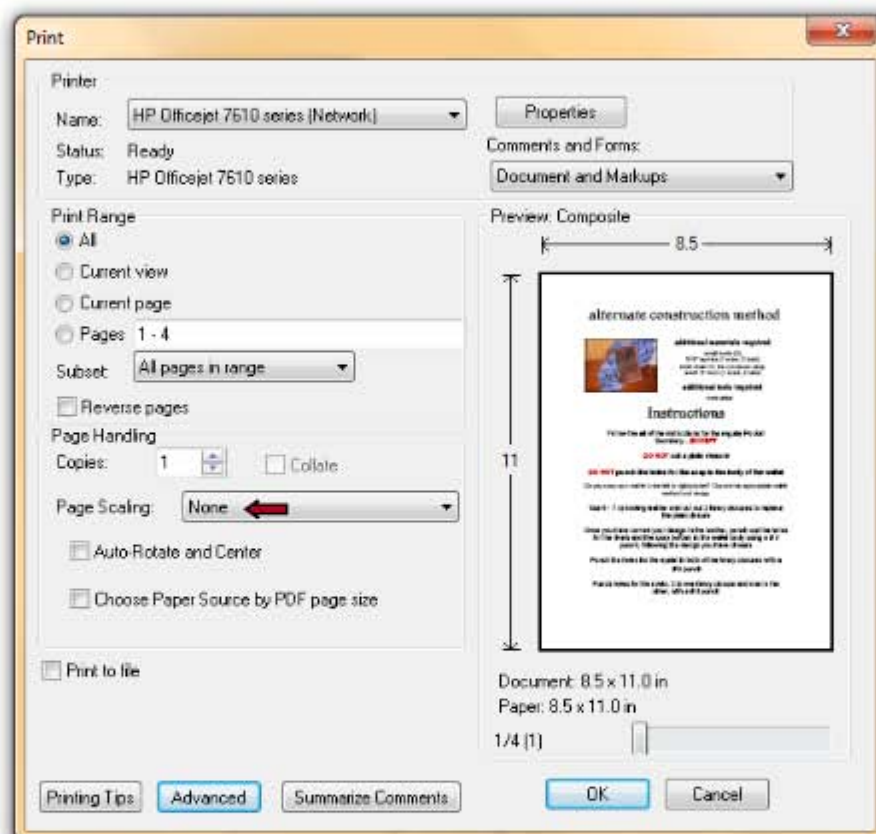

To print your patterns using ADOBE READER XI™, make sure the 'actual size' box is marked

alternate construction method

To print using earlier versions of ADOBE READER™, make sure you select 'NONE' on the drop down menu for 'PAGE SCALING'



Punch the holes for the eyelet in both of the fancy closures with a # 6 punch

Punch holes for the rivets, 2 in one fancy closure and one in the other, with a # 3 punch

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Materials List

6 - 7 oz tooling leather
double cap rivets, large (19)
waxed thread

Tools Required

stitching needles (2)
rivet setter
#3 punch
diamond punch (3mm)



Instructions

Cut out cup holder body, left and right supports from 6 – 7 oz tooling leather

With a # 3 punch, punch out all of the rivet holes in the handle sections of the cup holder body, left and right supports

Using a diamond punch, punch out the holes for the stitching in the cup holder body, left and right supports***

Carve/stamp/stain/dye as desired prior to assembly

*****NOTE***** - if cutting more than one cup holder at a time, cut all of one cup holder before moving on to the next. Keep pieces together while working on each cup holder. This will keep the accidental mismatch of rivet holes in the handles to a minimum!

Assembly

Using a saddle stitch, stitch the left and right supports to the sides of the cup holder body

Bring the handle together and insert a rivet at the top and at the bottom to line up the holes

DO NOT SET YET!

Insert the rest of the rivets in the handle. Set all of the rivets

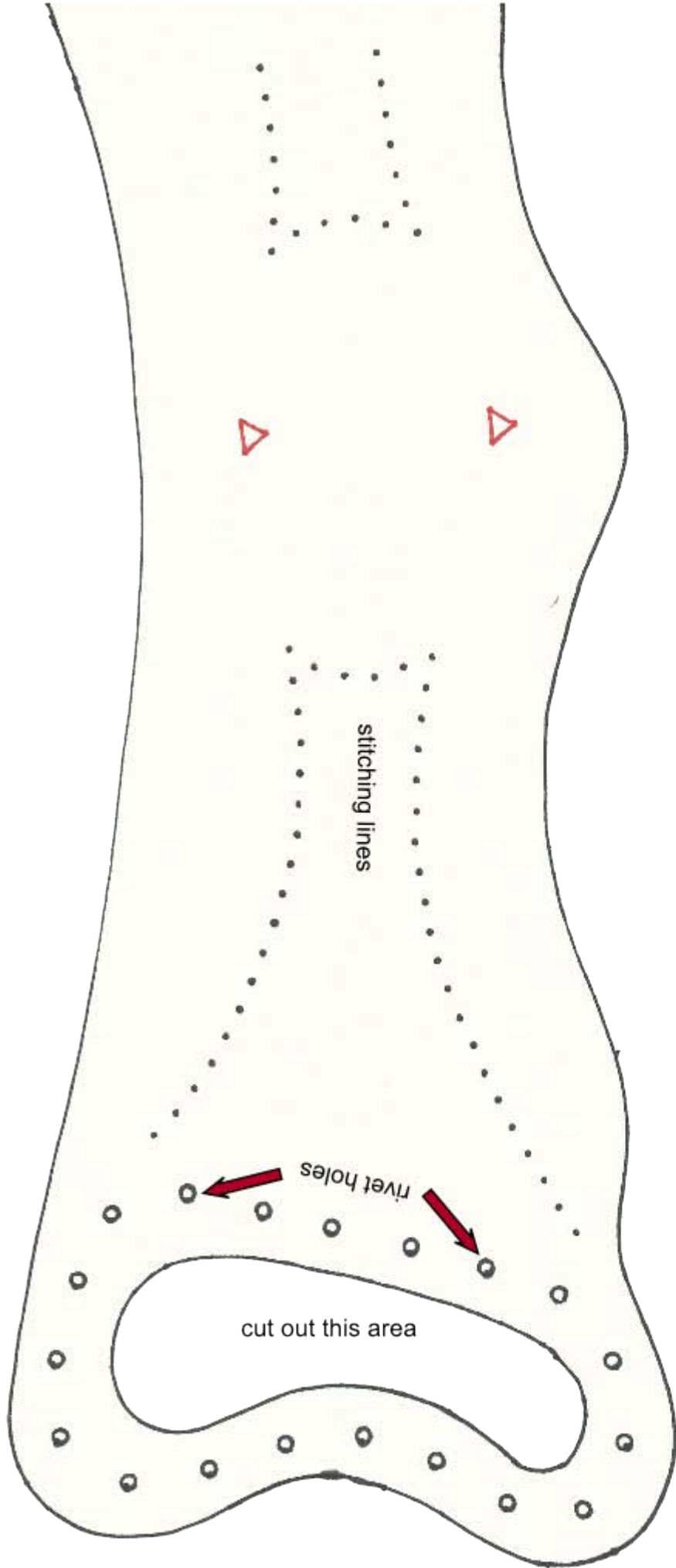
~~ To help keep the heads of the rivets from dimpling on one side, use a polyboard instead of the metal rivet set~~

Do a final trim on handle with a razor knife

Burnish the edges and edge coat if desired

Apply a final coat of wax and buff it out

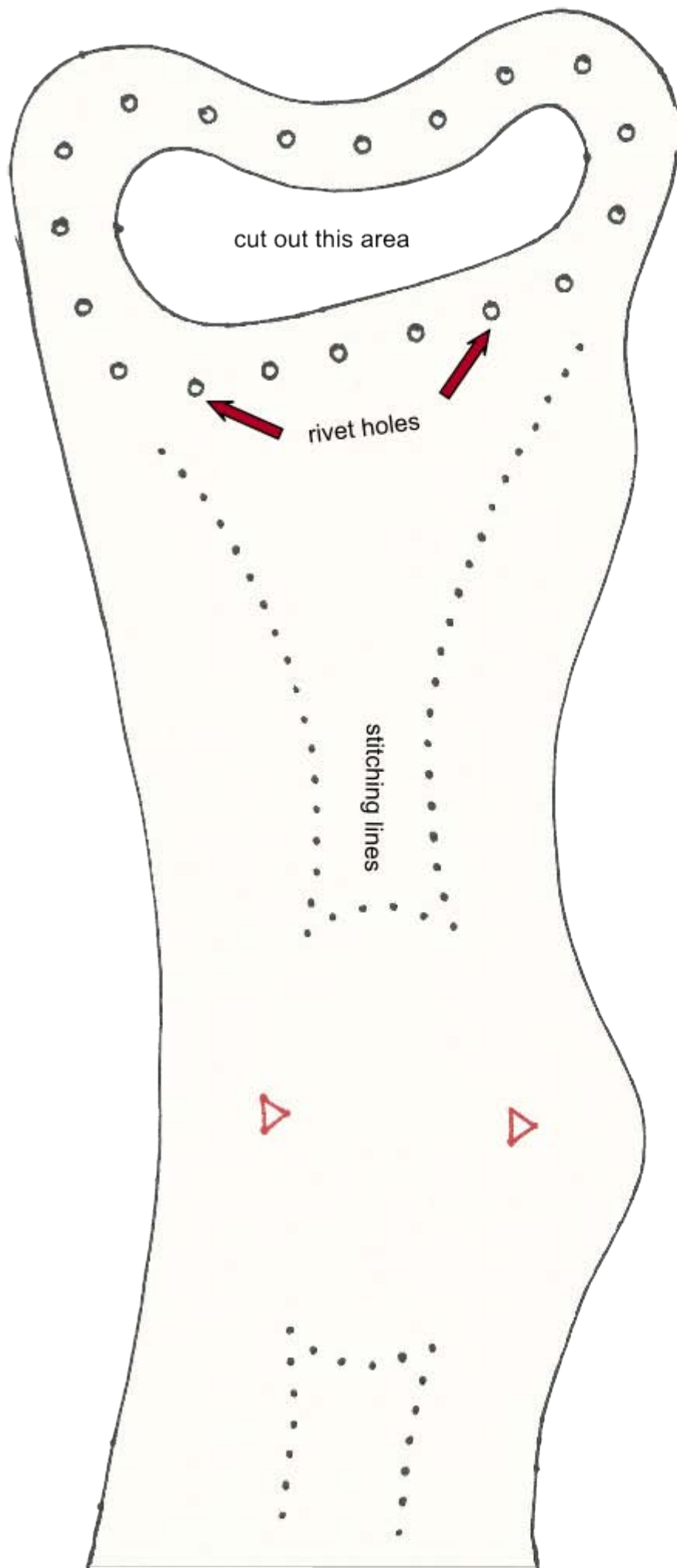

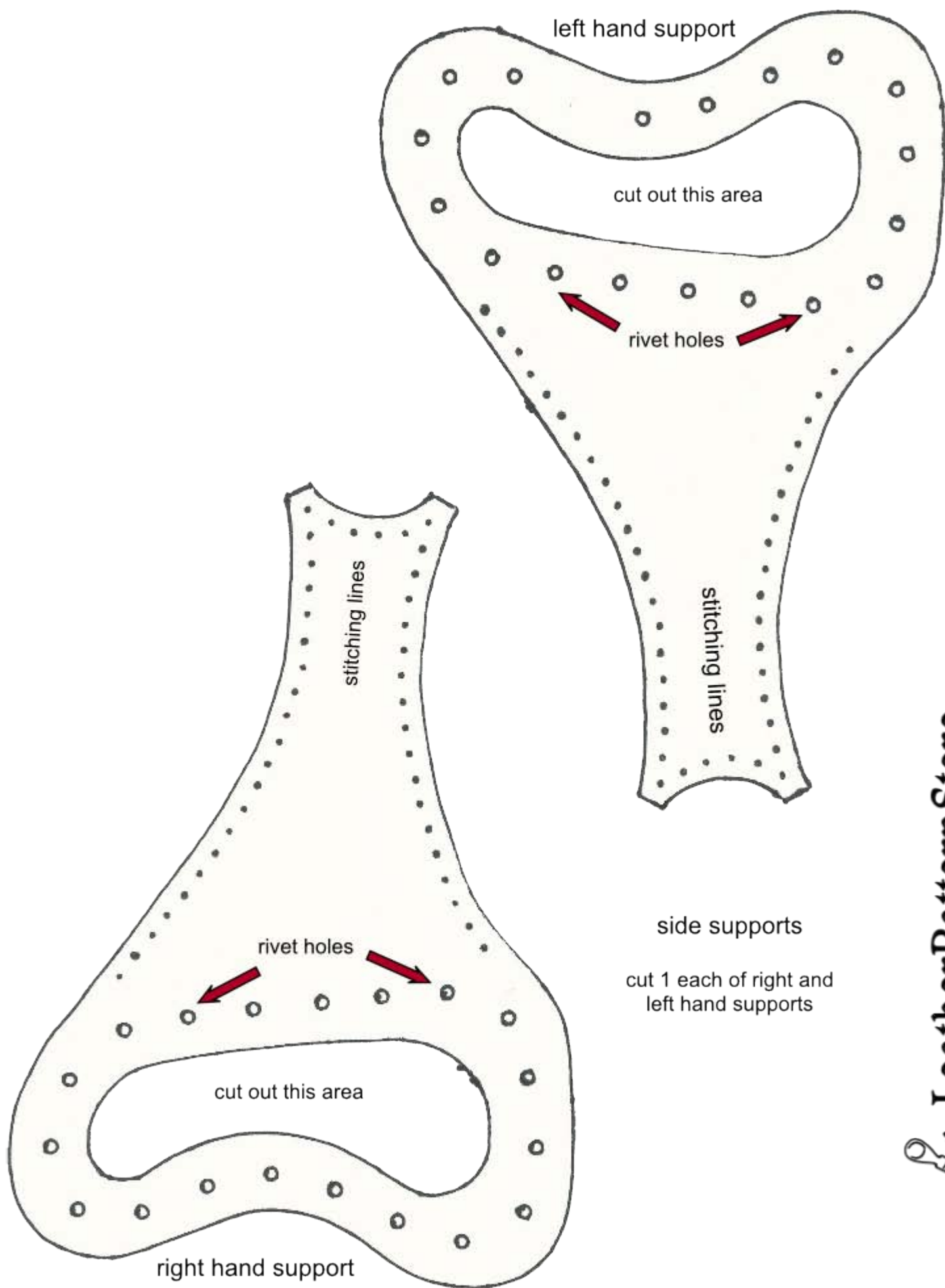
